

# Webfoots Take Rest After Twin Killing

The University of Oregon basketball team rested Wednesday afternoon and will receive the same diet today following their twin wins over the Washington State college Cougars Monday and Tuesday nights on McArthur court.

Coach Bill Borchers hopes that his Ducks will spend the customary practice hours on their books. The Webfoots' Northern California barnstorming tour overlapped into the first two days of the Winter quarter.

Oregon is currently undisputed leader of the infant Northern Division Pacific Coast Conference campaign, a full game ahead of defending champion University of Washington and two games over the Cougars.

Statistics released today by the

Athletic News Bureau lists Forward Bob Peterson as the leading scorer with 207 points. The nation's leading rebounder is followed by Chet Noe, center, and Captain Kenny Hunt, guard, with 177 and 140 tallies respectively.

Peterson wiped the backboards clean on 25 occasions Tuesday night for an overall series total of 46 in two nights. Peterson's 25 rebounds set a Pacific Coast Conference record. It was the third time in two years that the San Mateo, Calif. junior has altered the PCC record books.

The Ducks have scored 882 times in 14 games for an average output of 63 points per game; their opponents have tallied 868 digets for a 62 point average. Oregon has a

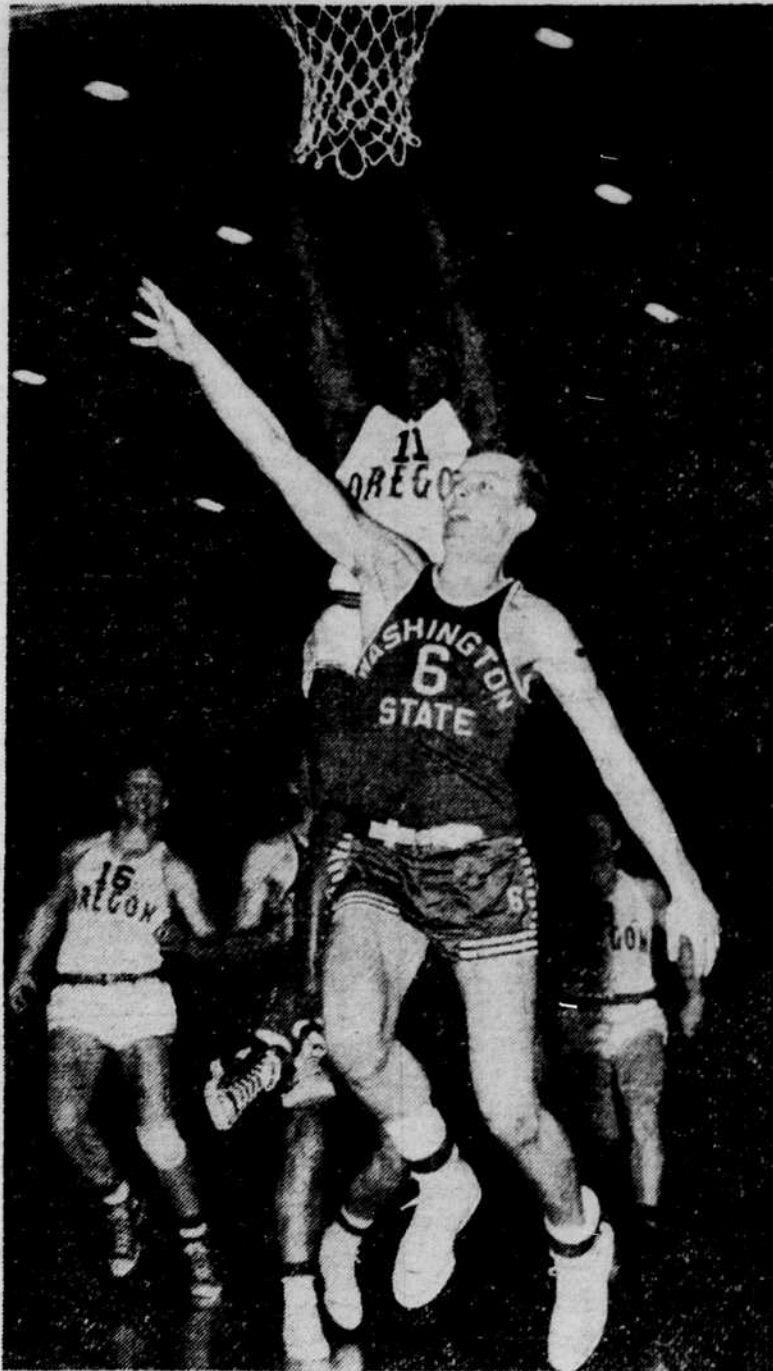
