Perfection was the keynote at McArthur Court yesterday as Coach Bill Borcher eased up on his Oregon hoopsters while preparing for the crucial series with University of Washington this weekend at Seattle.

In contrast to the workouts of the past week, which saw the Ducks leave the practice court in a weary condition at the end of each day, Borcher gave his

charges only a few minutes of running before dismissing them.

At the start of the session, the skyscraping Oregon coach spent a short time in working on tipping and fast breaks from the foul line. This was followed by a review of
