The world's greatest basketball show, the Harlem Globetrotters, will be playing before a near-capacity crowd when they tangle with the Oregon All-Stars here in Eugene on Jan. 22 if the advance ticket sale is any indication.

According to University of Oregon Ticket Manager Howard Lemons only 200 reserved seat tickets were left for the clash early Tuesday afternoon. Student tickets went on sale Tuesday and General Admission will be sold the day of the game according to latest reports.

The Trotters, making their second annual appearance here in Eugene, will bring such stars as Captain Babe Pressley, who has been with the club 15 years; William "Pop" Gates, veteran forward; Frank Washington, standout pivot man; and Carl Helem, now in his third year with the team.

Slated to perform for the Oregon All-Stars are ex-Duck stars Bob Hamilton, Roger Wiley, Dick Wilkins, Bob Amacher, Mel Krause, and Paul Sowers, and ex-Oregon Stater Dan Torrey.

Students are reminded that they will have to present their athletic cards at McArthur Court when buying their tickets.

Perfection Stressed As Borchner Prepares Squad for Huskies

Perfection was the keynote at McArthur Court yesterday as Coach Bill Borchner eased up on his Oregon hoopsters while preparing for the crucial series with University of Washington this weekend at Seattle.

In contrast to the workouts of the past week, which saw the Ducks leave the practice court in a weary condition at the end of each day, Borchner gave his charges only a few minutes of running before dismissing them.

At the start of the session, the skyscraping Oregon coach spent a short time in working on tipping and fast breaks from the foul line. This was followed by a review of Washington out-of-bounds plays.

Husky Offense

During the next quarter of an hour, a shirt team composed of Bud Covey, Bob Hawes, Hank Bonneman, Keith Farnam, and Jim Vranizan worked the offensive style of the Huskies in a dummy scrimmage against the skin team. The latter outfit was made up of Ken Hunt, Ron Bottler, Ken Wegner, Barney Holland, Bob Peterson, and Chet Noe.

The six players exchanged positions and alternated frequently. The order of play was also reversed when the skin team took over the duty of acting as the Washington squad. Both Peterson and Hunt found the basket several times during the workout.

Borchner also made use of the junior varsity unit under the direction of assistant coach Don Kirsch. Various combinations of JV basketballers worked offensive and defensive formations at both ends of the floor against the two units named above. The only personnel change made was that of Barney Holland, who was moved to the "shirt" team, spending time at both the forward and guard positions.

JV's vs. Varsity

The next item on Coach Borchner's drill schedule was a full-court pressing defense applied by the junior varsity against the varsity cagers. Perhaps because of their greater experience, the first stringers had little difficulty in keeping the ball away from the younger prospects.

In the only hard-fought action of the day, a varsity unit composed of Streeter, Peterson, Noe, Hunt, and Wegner had a hard time winning out over a JV team by a 14-9 score. Don Seigmund led the losers with five points and kept the varsity hoopsters on their toes with his ball-hawking tactics. The other four members of the squad were Howard Page, Wayne Johnson, Bob Hinman, and Hugh Marxer.

After this scrimmage, Borchner put his first five varsity men through about five minutes of "three-man killer," a conditioning exercise which justly deserves its name.

for the team since the beginning of the term. They are: Alex Elyer, freshman; Paul Byhre, freshman; Bill Blodgett, freshman; William Hempy, freshman; Rex Davis, freshman; Bob Hinman, freshman; Wayne Johnson, junior.

At the present time, Oregon leads the Northern division by virtue of their two victories over Washington State college. Washington is in second place, having split their series with Idaho. The Huskies beat Oregon State twice last weekend at Corvallis.

Oregon has not won a game at Edmundson Pavilion since 1947, when Dick Wilkins dropped in a 40-footer in the closing seconds of the game to give the Ducks a 49-48 victory. The last time the Webfoots were able to sweep a series from the Huskies on their home floor was in 1939, when the Ducks went on to win the NCAA National Championship.
