Seven Selected For Rifle Team

Seven students have been selected as the University of Oregon's official army ROTC rifle team.

They are Tetsuo Takasumi, senior in liberal arts, Frank Franciscovich, junior in business, Leo Nuttman, senior in geography and geology, Charles Perky, freshman in liberal arts, Ritchey Rust, senior in business, and Robert Tollefson, freshman in sociology.

Takasumi is high man on the team, recently firing a score of 172 out of a possible 200 in the 31st Annual William Randolph Hearst trophy competition, the military department stated. The team has seen competition with other college rifle squads throughout the United States and also in Alaska and the Hawaiian islands.

In charge of the rifle team is Lt. Col. John E. Londahl, who recently returned from ten months at the front lines in Korea. He is assisted by Sgt. James E. Heath, also a Korean combat veteran. Both served with the 2nd division while in action.
