

## World News Capsules Truman Picks Eastern Republican To Investigate Federal Corruption

President Truman has given Newbold Morris, prominent New York Republican the job of investigating the corruption in the federal government. Morris will have wide powers of investigation as special assistant to Attorney General Howard McGrath. However, McGrath said that Morris owes no allegiance to the attorney general or the president for his appointment and Morris has announced that the first federal agency he will investigate will be the Justice department.

### West Germany is the first . . .

. . . to agree formally to the Schuman plan for the pooling of European coal and steel. In ratifying the plan, West Germany agreed to share her coal and steel with five other European nations for the next fifty years.

### Progress in the Korean talks . . .

. . . is said to have been made in lower level discussion on truce ground rules. However, the Reds have refused to return 60,000 Korean civilians and are hesitating about agreeing to behind the lines inspection during the truce. The truce talks were to continue Friday night.

### Negotiations with Britain . . .

. . . are the only normal way to settle Egypt's dispute with Britain over the Suez canal and the Sudan, the new Egyptian premier, Aly Maher Pasha, said Friday. The chief question facing the two sides is on what basis to open the talks.

### Aneurin Bevan has accused . . .

. . . Prime Minister Winston Churchill's government of using Britain's financial crisis as an excuse for destroying socialized medicine. Bevan attacked a government bill which calls for sharp deductions in the national health service and said its passage would mean the end of socialized medicine. Fellow laborites are talking of Bevan as a future prime minister.

### Senator Estes Kefauver has entered . . .

. . . in the primary elections of six states. He is running for the presidential nomination in Ohio, Illinois, New Hampshire, California and Florida.

Meanwhile, the Republican supporters of Taft and Eisenhower both claim to have made gains for their candidate. Taft forces claim to have the pledges of eight delegates from New York and the Eisenhower supporters say that the first two delegates elected in Oklahoma have pledged their votes to Eisenhower.

### The Marine Corps . . .

. . . has awarded its 12th Medal of Honor to S/Sgt. Archie Van Winkle of Pinehurst, Wash. He received the award for continuing to fight in the face of heavy odds and despite a serious wound.

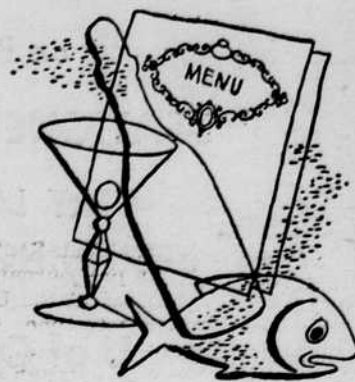
Decisions will be based on 25 points for originality of theme, 10 points for color and 15 points for sentiment of the signs.
