

# Dr. William Jones Fills New Administrative Post

A key figure in the current campus building program is W. C. Jones, dean of administration. One of Jones' many duties in this newly-established administrative position is to act as a channel between the University planning committee and President Newburn.

"My other duties as dean of administration can't be listed 'one,

two, three.'" Jones asserted. "I serve as an administrative assistant to the president, handle some public relations and represent the president when he has conflicting obligations."

Jones gave up his seven-year post as president of Whittier college in Southern California to take over his present job fall term. But he is not new to the Oregon

campus. He was head of the political science department here from 1941 to 1944.

During those years he also supervised policies for some 600 employees of the Oregon State Public Welfare commission.

Jones was graduated from Whittier college, received his M.A. in business administration at the University of Southern Cali-

fornia, and took his Ph.D. degree at the University of Minnesota in public administration and economics.

One example of Jones' duties was his participation fall term in the alumni tours, during which he addressed service clubs and community groups around the state on the general service of the University to the State of Oregon.

Jones lives here with his wife and a son who is a sophomore at University high school. Another son is a senior at Whittier college.
