Keeping their conference record in the win column will be tough for the Duck swimmers as they take on Washington State College at Pullman and the University of Idaho at Moscow this Friday and Saturday.

The Cougars will probably give Oregon its stiffest test yet this season. They have been highly underrated in the northern division. Actually, they have the conference champion in the 1500-meter freestyle and also they have the numher one man in the 200-yard backstroke.

He ordered his magis-trates to "search suspected tenements and make arrests." Henry VIII died of satiation.


Charles I was bowling at Northmamptonshire when he was caught
