Duck Swimmers Practice for Meet

The University of Oregon swimming team will leave for Pullman, Washington this weekend to face the Washington State Cougars, for its second dual meet of the season. Last week the Duck team was victorious over Oregon State scoring a 58-28 win.

WSC has not been voted very highly in the Northern division conference, but Coach Borchardt is drilling his swimmers heavily this week, especially Gordon Edwards and Bob Oringdolph, the distance men. Edwards, a junior from Portland broke two long-standing meet records finishing at the time of 2:20.4 in the 220 yd. freestyle, which erases the old mark of 2:22.2 set by OSC's Bob Brownell in 1939.

He also broke the 440 yd. freestyle record recording a time of 5:08.7. The old record was 5:15.0 set by Robinson of Oregon in 1942.

During practice Wednesday, Coach Borchardt held time trials for the majority of the time spent at practice. The results were not available.

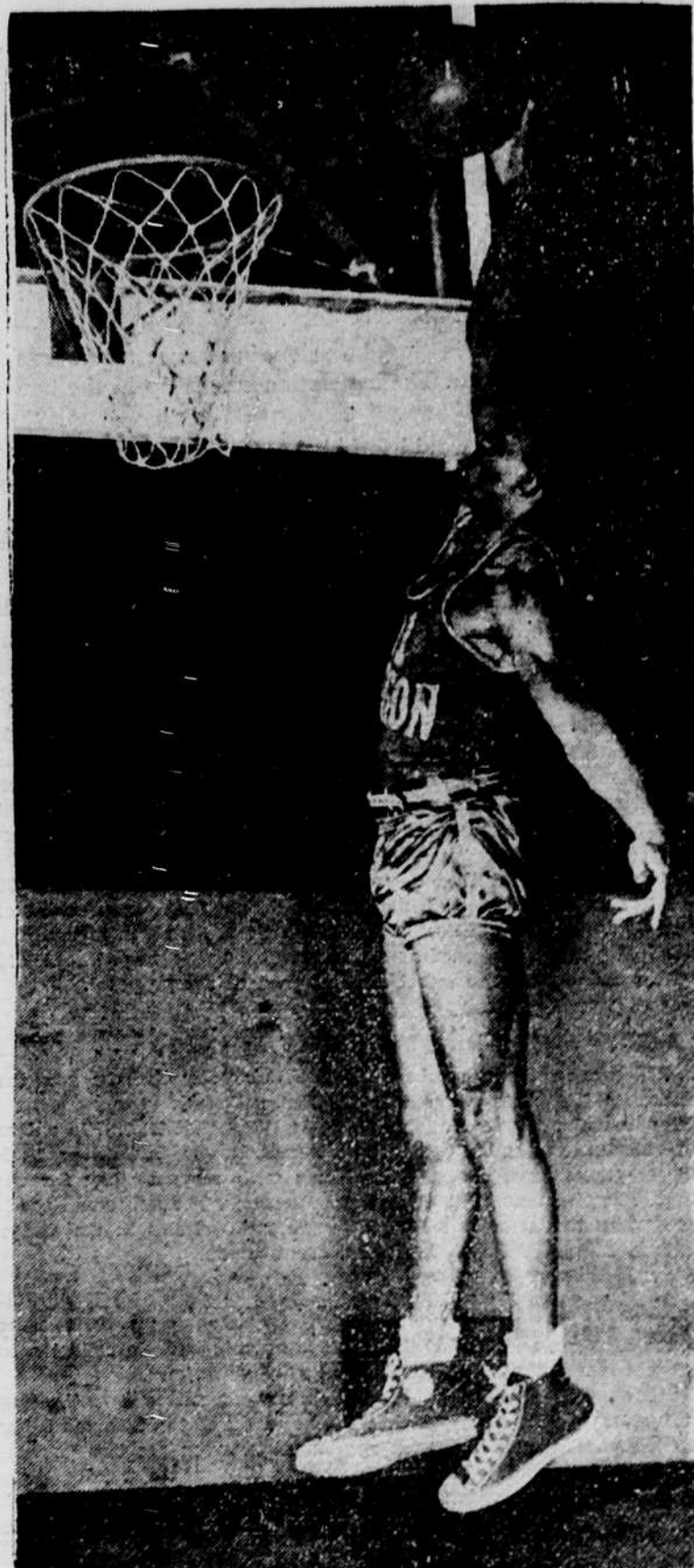
Philadelphians Win

SAE, Phi Delt Victors In IM Track Meet

In Intramural track action Wednesday afternoon, Sigma Alpha Epsilon rolled to a 45-18 victory over Delta Upsilon, and Phi Delta Theta downed Hunter hall, 47-21.

The SAE squad took every first place but the high jump as they garnered their victory. Hal Davis led the SAE's with first in the broad jump, 40 yard dash, and a place on the winning relay team. Bob Buckley, also of the winners, took first in the pole vault and the hurdles.

No one man on the winning Phi Delt squad stood out in their decision over Hunter. Dick Zimmerman, hurdler on last year's frosh track team, won that event with a fast 5.5 second time, and took a third in the high jump to become the leading Phi Delt point-producer.
