

Aquaducks Defeat British Columbia In Non-conference Match, 60-24

The University of Oregon swimming team, coached by John Borchardt, took a non-conference meet from the University of British Columbia water team by a 60-24 count in a meet Saturday at the local men's pool.

The Duck mermen now enter a week of extensive training for the vital contest with the powerful University of Washington Huskies at Eugene on Feb. 22.

Against the UBC team, the Ducks took nine out of ten events spearheaded by two wins apiece by Freestyler Gordon Edwards and Kosh Terada.

Edwards garnered first in the 220 yard freestyle and the 440 yard freestyle. Terada, transfer from Honolulu, took the 180 yard individual medley and the 200 yard backstroke.

Milt Kotoshiroda, Duck co-captain, tied the Northern Division 60 yard freestyle record set by Campbell of Washington. His time was 29.4 seconds.

Ducks Stop Staters To Grab Third Place

Webfoots Take Opener, 57-44

Coach Bill Borchers' improving Oregon Webfoots started off their "Civil War" series with the cellar-dwelling OSC Beavers by notching a 57-44 victory at Gill Coliseum Friday night.

It was a red-hot last quarter which finally clinched the contest for the Ducks, as they poured in 14 points to greatly lengthen their 43-39 third place lead. The victory vaulted the Webfoots into third place in the Northern Division conference.

Suits Left Home
An unusual feature of the game was the fact that the Ducks played the first half with the uniforms of the Oregon junior varsity, as their regular game suits were left behind and did not arrive until halftime.

Free-throw shooting was the difference between the two teams, as the Ducks converted 29 out of 43 attempts, while the Beavers could get just 16 of 33.

The expected riding for big Bob Peterson did not materialize, and the conduct of the crowd was restrained, considering the heat of the rivalry.

Johnston Fouls Out
One factor in the last-quarter Beaver foldup was the absence of blond Danny Johnston, who had 17 points for the game and 13 in the first half to lead the Aggies to a 29-29 tie at intermission.

The Ducks winning surge came with two minutes left in the third period and the score tied, 39-all, for the seventh and last deadlock of the game.

Ken Wegner and Ken Hunt sunk free throws, and Keith Farnum's hook from the key gave Oregon its 43-39 third period advantage.

Hunt fast-broke for a cripple to open the fourth period, and Wegner zeroed in an underhanded flip from behind the backboard to make it 47-39. Three more charity tosses, one by Farnum and two by Peterson, made it 50-39 with three minutes gone, and from then on the Ducks coasted in to the win.

Noe Gets 18
Oregon's Chet Noe was high scorer for the game with 18, and was effective on the backboards. Peterson scored only six points, but led rebounders with 19 recoveries.

The Ducks had a mediocre .242 field goal shooting average with 14 out of 58 attempts. OSC was even worse with a .215; a mark which was caused chiefly by the miserable Beaver shooting in the final half. They hit only two field goals out of 25 attempts.

In Saturday night's varsity preliminary at McArthur court the Oregon Jayvees took their sixth shellacking at the hands of the Oregon State crew by a score of 67-46. The local boys never threatened the visitors who dominated in every department; shooting, ballhandling, and rebounding. Throughout the game the junior Beavers employed a fast break offense that livened up an otherwise dull contest.

The Blackshirts rolled to a 27-15 first quarter lead and never let the Ducklings come any closer than nine points during the rest of the game. This came late in the second period when Howard Page and Ron Phillips kept Oregon in the game and brought the score to 31-40. The Beavers were outscored 16-15, a meager one point advantage which failed to help the Oregon cause.

The third stanza opened with a seven and a half minute point drought for Oregon while OSC

Ducklings Lose To Baby Beavers At Corvallis, 68-55

The Oregon State junior varsity again has proved its superiority over Don Kirsch's Oregon JV's, as it racked up a 68-55 victory over the Ducklings Friday night in a preliminary to the varsity contest at Gill Coliseum in Corvallis.

The OSC team led all the way, paced by Reggie Halligan, Bud Shirtcliff, and Bob Frantz. At the end of the first quarter the score stood 17-12; at halftime it was 30-26, and the Beavers pulled away fast during the third period to lead 51-38.

Halligan tallied 17 to lead all scorers, followed by teammates Shirtcliff and Frantz with 14 apiece.

Howard (Lefty) Page of the Ducks accounted for 13 to pace his team.

Pete Leads Way In 64-55 Decision

University of Oregon's unpredictable Webfoots extended to Oregon State college the legendary sorrowful Beavers into the Pacific Coast conference's Northern Division cellar championship for the second consecutive season.

Coach Bill Borchers' Ducks smothered the Corvallis invaders 64-55 in McArthur court Saturday night and not only eluded the cellar, but also passed Washington State college's idle Cougars and swept to within hailing distance of the second-place University of Idaho Vandals.

Consistent Bob Peterson and Kenny Hunt were instrumental carpenters in nailing down the slats of the Beaver coffin. Big Pete, who is thoroughly disliked by the Benton county partisans, didn't add to his popularity by tallying 14 points and dominating the backboards, in spite of the taller Bevos. Senior Guard Hunt, playing in his next-to-last McArthur contest, deposited 12 digits to the Orange downfall.

Had not the Ducks connected for a stratospheric 483 percentage of their shots, the game might have been the Beavers'. Oregon attempted 20 field goals in the first half and was successful 12 times, which amounts to a torrid reading of 60 per cent. OSC, on the other hand, labored for their 39 shots and sank nine of them for a .231 reading. Slats Gill's club had an over-all average of .254.

Gill juggled his lineup, replacing Jim Nau and Ron Fundingsland with Dick Brust and Bill Toole. The new pair was able to account for 19 points, but most of them were contributed after the Ducks had seized the lead from the Beavers with 3:50 of the first period showing on the electric timepiece.

Keith Farnam, who has an affinity for scoring in bursts, pushed the Ducks onto the black side of the ledger with a couple of left-handed push shots for a 13-10 count. Oregon led 18-14 after 10 minutes of action, as Ken Wegner, guard, looped in a semi-hook shot.

Center Chet Noe and Forward Mel Streter caught fire in the second quarter for 10 of the Webfoots' 17 tallies. The "Flying Street-car" stunned a near-capacity gathering of 7,600 with a southpaw hookshot in the vicinity of the key which took off like a bullet and swished neatly, a minute before the intermission.

Seven Shots
State's Brust, a 19-year-old sophomore from La Porte, Ia., scored seven times during the canto to keep the slim Beaver hopes alive. Oregon increased its lead by three points and led at the intermission, 35-28.
