# Ducks Tip Idaho 66-60, Vault into Second Spot

University of Oregon's Webfoots rocketed into second place in the Northern Division PCC standings by five percentage points, with a 66-60 decision over the University of Idaho Monday night in the Vandals' Memorial Gymnasium, Moscow, Ida.

Led by Kenny Hunt, Oregon's fire-brand guard, who tallied 19 points and has a 57 mark output in the first three games of the Inland Empire series, Hartley Krueger, Idaho center, dumped in 18 scores for runner-up honors.

### Vandal Rallies Fail

A crowd of 3400 rabid Idahoans saw their favorites stage three desperate rallies in the second half, all of which failed to over-haul Oregon's shaky leads. The Ducks, who blew a 15 point half-time edge to Washington State college Saturday night, came close to putting on an encore.

The Webfoots, thanks to a flurry of buckets before the third quarter closed, led 59-50 at that juncture. Hunt broke in for a layup at the outset of the fourth stanza to counter Tom Flynn's push shot.

The dam nearly gave way as first-unit Captain Herb Millard deposited a layup and Krueger whirled and canned a hook shot at the 6:30 mile-stone. With slightly more than five minutes remaining Center Chet Noe, who scored 14 points, fouled the Idaho center, Krueger, in the act of shooting. Krueger coolly converted his pair of shots and Idaho had pulled to 59-61.

### Pete Comes Through

At this point, the Ducks stiffened instead of folding before the wild-eyed Moscow partisans. The Webfoots, who possibly froze the ball too early against WSC Saturday, slowed down, but didn't im-

mediately attempt to put the game in cold storage.

Mel Streeter tried a push shot and failed, but clutch-playing Bob Peterson smacked in the rebound for the crucial bucket. Noe collared a lay-up on the end of a drive and Streeter zeroed a free throw for a 66-59 margin with 4:15 to go.

Oregon began a genuine stall and kept uninterrupted possession for two minutes when the ball was intercepted. Noe hacked Krueger and big Hartley hit with the free toss for the final count.

The score was deadlocked four times in the opening quarter. Noe's hook shot for the first bucket of the evening came at the end of two minutes of wild-shooting. Idaho's longest margin, 9-6, followed Krueger's two hooks, and free throws by Krueger and southpaw-shooting Harlan Melton.

Oregon bolstered its 17-13 quarter lead to 24-17, but a typical

Chuck Finley rally over-came that lee-way when Melton hit with another gift toss for a 28-27 count. The Vandals' second platoon took over at the 27-21 mark and the "three ems" Melton, Bill Mather and Dwight Morrison cannonaded the bracket with a pair of long shots and a rebound, respectively.

Ken Wegner and Hunt out-raced gun with a pair of two-pointers to give the Ducks a 37-32 half-time reading, after the Eugene five and shattered an earlier, 31-31 stand-off.

The Webfoots boasted a nine-point, 43-34 cleft after Streeter's jump shot at the free-throw line, but the unflinching Vandals recovered and closed to 46-40 and finally narrowed the gap to 47-45 at the 4:45 clock-watch.

### Tonight's Tilt Crucial

Oregon's second-place margin of .538 to .533 will be in jeopardy tonight at Moscow as the Vandals close out their season. A victory for the Idahoans would insure them no less than a tie for the spot in final standings; if the Ducks win they will need a split in their final brace of games with Oregon State college this weekend to repeat their 1951 finish.
