

Musicals Open On April 18

The music school and the University theater will present a double-bill musical opening April 18 featuring "The Old Maid and the Thief," directed by Frederick J. Hunter, instructor in speech, and "The Devil and Daniel Webster," directed by Horace Robinson, associate professor of speech.

Audrey Mistretta will play Miss Todd in "The Old Maid," a gay, farce-comedy. Anita MacGregor will play Laetetai; Dorothy Anderson, Miss Pinkerton, and Walter Martin, Bob.

Morris Beachy plays Jabez Stone, the subject of controversy in "The Devil." This is a comedy folk opera taken from Stephen Vincent Benet's famous narrative poem and sung to the music of Douglas Moore.

Janice Evans plays Mary Stone, Jabez's wife. Larry Swanson is cast as Scratch and Gordon Howard plays Daniel Webster.

Black Will Talk On Philosophy

Max Black, professor of philosophy at Cornell University and visiting professor at the University of Washington will be on campus Friday to lecture on "Assertion and Presupposition."

Black, who is an authority in logic, semantics and philosophy of language, is being brought here by the department of philosophy under Alburey Castell.

A no-host cafeteria dinner at 6 p.m. in the Student Union will precede the talk. Professor Meldon of the University of Washington and Arthur Pap, assistant professor of philosophy at Oregon, will make formal comments preceding the general lecture discussion.

Two Commissions Awarded Cadets
