Top Cost for Junior Weekend Floats Set at \$70 for Each Combination

The maximum cost for construction of Junior Weekend floats was set by the float committee Thursday at \$70. This is to be the combined cost of all groups in a pairing.

Co-chairman of the committee, Jim Owens, said that floats will be judged on originality, quality of workmanship and adherence to the general theme "Childhood Memories."

Themes for floats will be due in at the Junior Weekend office by April 23. Organizations, however, should turn in an alternate theme in case of duplication.

Itemized Account Required
By Thursday, May 8, an itemized account of the cost of each float must be turned in.

Floats should be completed by noon on Saturday, May 10. Owens said the parade would start promptly at 4 p.m., forming near the railroad station at 4th and Willamette. The absolute deadline for entering floats will be 4:30 p.m. and floats will be lined up on a first come, first served basis.

Judges will be spaced evenly along the parade route which will follow Willamette to 13th, up 13th to University, then up University

where it will disband at MacArthur court.

Winners Get Cup

The men's organization and the women's organization responsible for the winning float will each receive a cup.
