

Ducklings Victors In Springfield Game

The Oregon Junior varsity baseball team solidly trounced Springfield high 23 to 5 for their third win of the season against no losses. The game was played Tuesday afternoon on the Oregon field.

Wild pitching errors by Springfield accounted for the huge score of the Ducklings. In the first inning Springfield pitcher Thompson walked five and hit Paul Byhre with a wild pitch. Altogether the Millers committed eight errors against the Ducklings' five.

The lads from Oregon also out-

hit the high school nine. Oregon collected 23 runs on 14 hits and Springfield got five runs on seven hits.

Bill Blodgett, a left fielder converted from pitcher, got two doubles and a single in his three official times at the plate. The fourth time at bat he smashed out a long ball into right center field that the center fielder not only dropped but allowed Blodgett to go to third on the play.

Jim Tennyson also had a very good day at the plate. Jim was credited with a walk, a double, a single and a triple. He also drove in three runs.

Catcher Neal Marlett again was a dangerous man at bat. Marlett took over the catching duties after both Don Hedgepeth and Chuck Greenley turned out for Springfield football. Big Neal got the first Oregon hit in the fourth inning. He socked a long double with the bases loaded in the first, in the third he hammered out a triple, in the fifth he got on second on a fielder's choice and an error, and in the 7th Neal got on first by way of an error on the shortstop.

Spring Football Drills Continue; Casanova Expected Back Today

Head Football Coach Len Casanova was scheduled to arrive on the scene this morning to take charge of the University of Oregon's spring grid practice—now in its third day.

Casanova is recovering from a major back operation which forced him to postpone his return from an alumni tour of California for two weeks.

Meanwhile Coaches Gene Harlow, Jack Roche, Johnny McKay and ex-Duck Center Brad Ecklund have been handling the chores. Harlow described the attitude as good. "We've had to make quite a few changes, but everyone wants to play. They've shown a lot of pepper for this time of the year,"

Harlow said.

Harlow's mention of changes was in reference to the wholesale movement of ends to tackle and guard positions. The Ducks have had a surplus of flankers and an obvious scarcity of experienced tackles, guards and centers.

Quarterbacks Hal Dunham, Barney Holland and Wally Russell were pressed into passing roles Tuesday afternoon; McKay and Roche drilled the backs on short, flat tosses. Harlow worked with the remainder of the squad, the linesmen, who number around the 40 mark. They stressed blocking and tackling, mostly in dummy drills.

Webfoots Hold Hitting Practice; WSC Due Friday

Coach Don Kirsch directed his varsity baseball squad through a typical drill Tuesday on a damp and slightly muddy Howe field diamond. Hitting practice occupied most of the afternoon, with each batter getting in about five good licks at the plate.

Joe Sugura was meeting the ball well, as he rapped out several line drives that would have gone for base hits in a game. Pitcher Don Seigmund also sent several scorching liners into the outfield.

The varsity hurlers were switching off at throwing to the hitters, with freshman catcher Ron Bottler spending most of the drill behind the plate.

The Ducks are preparing to meet the Washington State Cougars Friday and Saturday in the Northern Division opener to be played here in Eugene.

An indication of the strength of past Cougar baseball teams is given by the results of the last five years' ND baseball races. Buck Bailey's men finished first from 1947 to 1950 and were second last year.
