## Local Realtor Speaks To Campus NAACP About Neighborhood

Robert Prescott, local realtor, spoke and led discussion before a regular meeting of the campus chapter of National Association for the Advancement of Colored People Tuesday in Gerlinger hall.

Prescott offered definitions of two different types of neighborhoods, the spiritual and the geographic.

A spiritual neighborhood was de-

defined as one limited only by capacity of the mind. Such a "thought neighborhood" extends through all fields of thought, "from the physical sciences to the humanities," he said.

The geographic neighborhood is thus a materialistic, physical group, defined by such factors as streets, houses and boundaries, he continued.

Prescott cited Article 34 of the code of a national realtors association. This provision dictates that real estate agents shall restrict an area against any factors or individuals "detrimental to the present occupants of that area."

This practice is illustrated by zoning of a city into residential areas, business areas, and commercial areas, he said. Furthermore, the article provides restriction according to the living standards of prospective newcomers to a neighborhood, regardless of race, religion or creed.

Prescott then advanced his theory for alleviation of the housing problem for Negroes in this city. He advocated building a low-cost housing area open to all those needing housing facilities. The chief problem, in Prescott's estimation, was to find enough individuals in the community to finance the cost of such a project.

Much discussion was held on this point, for most members of the campus chapter felt that education was necessary before peoples of two different races would comfortably live side-by-side.

Bob Holloway, chapter president, announced to the membership that four committees have been organized and places on any of these committees are open to members. They are research, publicity, finance and program.
