Ducks Top Idaho, 13-6

Oregon's hit-happy Ducks bounced back to gain a tie for the Northern Division league lead with a convincing 13-6 victory over Idaho's Vandals yesterday afternoon at Howe field before 1100 partisan fans. The sultry afternoon brought a total of 19 runs and 25 hits in the scoring melee.

Oregon was forced to come from behind a four-run deficit in the first inning and came through with flying colors with 11 runs on eight hits. This initial frame saw a total of five pitchers toe the slab, two for Oregon and three for Idaho.

Bill Mays, hefty right-hander, started the tilt for Oregon and was replaced, with two men out and four runs tallied, by Norm Forbes, lanky freshman from Victoria, B. C.

Forbes, hurling from the right side, displayed an excellent curve, drop and varied his speed to turn in a fine pitching chore. He was just wild enough to be effective, walking four, striking out six, and allowing six hits and two runs in the seven and one-third innings he

worked.

Idaho Coach Chuck Finley used three pitchers in the first inning, all right-handers, and the last of these, Mel Reynolds, went the distance for the Moscow sluggers.

The first-inning hit barrage started with Idaho, when, with two out, their leading hitter, Bruce McIntosh, (.579) drew a walk. Third baseman George Huffman followed him with a single infield, and scored after McIntosh on a sharp single to center field by catcher Jerry Ogle.

Dave Paulson and Flip Keffner both doubled, scoring Ogle and Paulson. Enter Norm Forbes, closing the door on Idaho runs until the third inning, when, again with two outs, Paulson walked, advanced on Keffner's single, and scored on Brown's liner to center. The fourth canto brought another tally when the first three batters, Earl Huffman, brother of George, H. A. Butler and McIntosh all singled.

The 11-run splurge in the first inning by the Ducks was manufactured on singles by Shaw and Livesay and walks to Nelson and Sugura, ticketing the starting Idaho pitcher, Lloyd Schiller, to the showers.

He was quickly followed (to the showers) by Dewey Good, who obligingly gave up a single to Ron Bottler, pushing two runs across the plate, a walk to Averill, and a base to Settecase on a pitch to the small of the back, followed by a solid single to Nick Schmer and a similar one to Norm Forbes.

Sophomore Mel Reynolds replaced Good and Mel was an early victim of two well-placed bunts, one by George Shaw and one by Livesay, both reaching first credited with hits. Forbes scored on a deep drive to left by Daryle Nelson, after tagging up, and Shaw and Livesay both scored on Sugura's single to left.

Livesay scored the eleventh and final run of the inning on a tag-up from Bottler's deep fly to left, and Averill finally ended the blasting with a deep fly to center, allowing Reynolds to escape unhurt. The inning lasted 38 minutes in all, and, with the exception of only 4 runs, proved to be the big run-producer.

Tennis Team Meets OSC

Saturday will be the big day for the varsity net men, with the Ducks making the long trip to Corvallis for their Northern Division opener with OSC.

Oregon scored again in the third when Livesay doubled, advanced to third on a wild pitch, and scored on Sugura's fly to center. Oregon picked up their final digit in the last frame on Norv Ritchey's walk, stolen base, and single by Averill.

Fireman Stan Aune, tall senior from Springfield, relieved Forbes in the last inning and set the Vandals down 1-2-3, giving Forbes the victory and Oregon its tie for the league lead.

Power was displayed at the plate for Oregon yesterday, the leading hitters being center fielder Jim Livesay, with four hits in five times at bat, two of these doubles, Schmer with two hits in three attempts, and Norm Forbes and George Shaw, each with two hits in four tries. Ron Bottler and Joe Sugura each drove in three runs, leading that department, while Dave Paulson drove in two runs for the losers. Keffner and Brown each belted the ball for two hits, while McIntosh and Brown were the standout defensive players for Idaho.

The Ducks meet Portland U. Saturday at Portland, then return to ND action Monday and Tuesday against Washington at Eugene.
