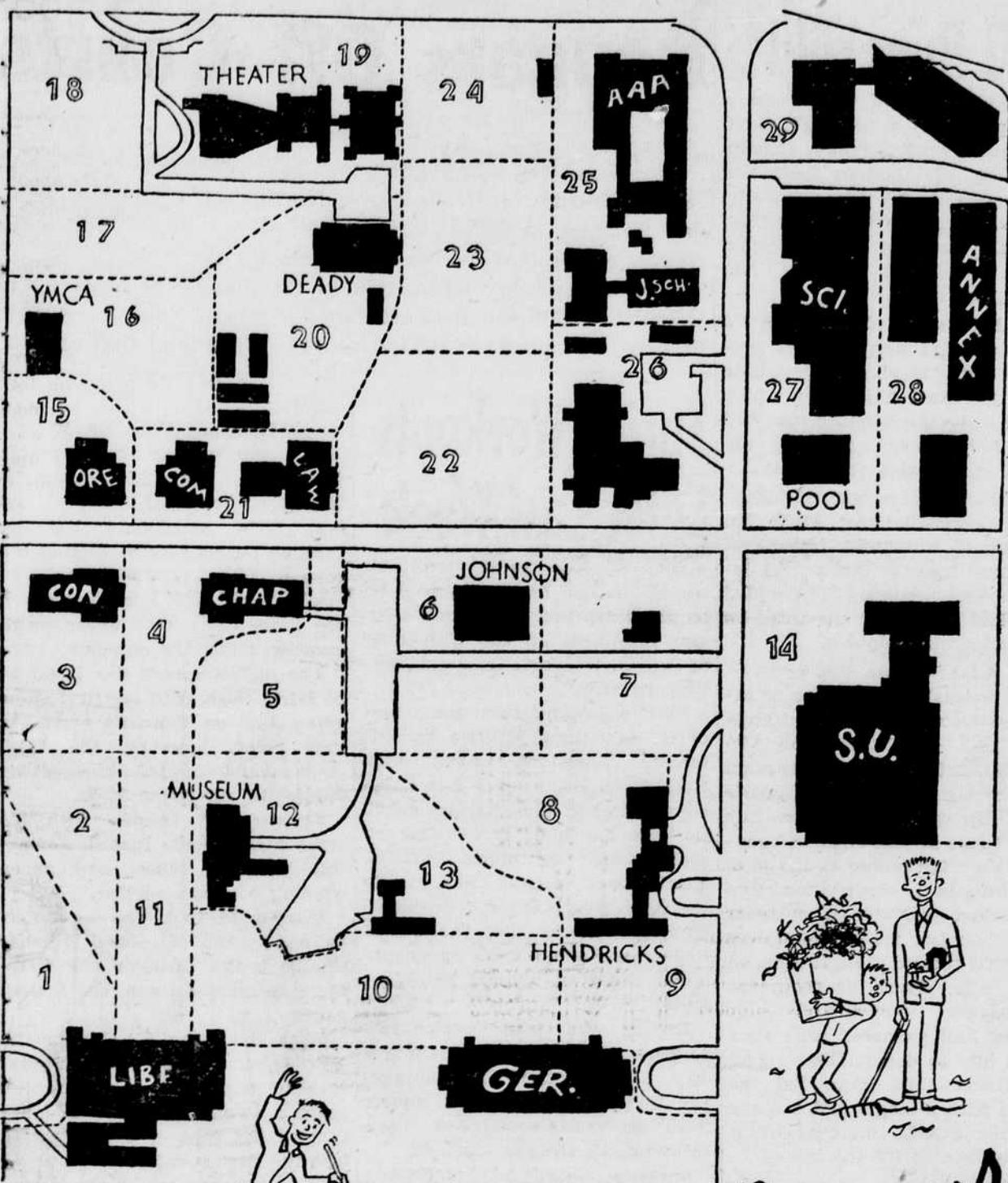

Vocalist to Sing At Junior Prom

When Johnny Reitz and his orchestra appear for the Junior Prom next Friday night, featured with the band will be vocalist Marcelaine. A singer of sentimental ballads and hit tunes of the day, "Marcy" has been well received by the dancing public wherever she has appeared with the Reitz band.

Previous to signing a contract with Reitz she sang in leading clubs on the West Coast and in the Middle West, but she prefers singing with a professional road band because of the greater opportunities to meet the public.

For the first time in Student Union dances, the balcony adjoining the Dads' Lounge will be furnished with new lawn chairs and tables outside. The furniture was purchased by the Student Union.

"Dress for the dance will be formal; forms for women and dark suits or tuxes for the men," according to Karla Van Loan, campus social chairman. Flowers are optional. Closing hours of 2 a.m. have been granted by the office of student affairs for the dance which will last from 9 p.m. to 1:30 a.m. DST.

Tickets are now being sold for the dance by junior campus salesmen. They are competing for the prizes of \$10 and \$2.50 which will be awarded the two salesmen who sell the most tickets. The price of the tickets is \$2.50.

A letter from James J. Overlock, activities manager at the University of Washington, was received by the Junior Prom committee in regard to the selection of Johnny Reitz and his orchestra to play for the dance.

Overlock stated that the Johnny Reitz band, which played at Washington's Senior ball, proved to be a big success among the students and more than justified their confidence in the orchestra's ability.
