Popkin ends the article with this paragraph: "This quality of irony is present even in the way Chekhov had of talking about his plays. Although he would insist that they were comedies, on being questioned further, he would only say, 'It's in the play, all in the play.' His reluctance to discuss the matter suggests that he was keeping alive one of the most ironic jokes of all—the very idea that plays turning on suicide, attempted murder, forced mortgages and wasted lives could in any sense be considered comedies."

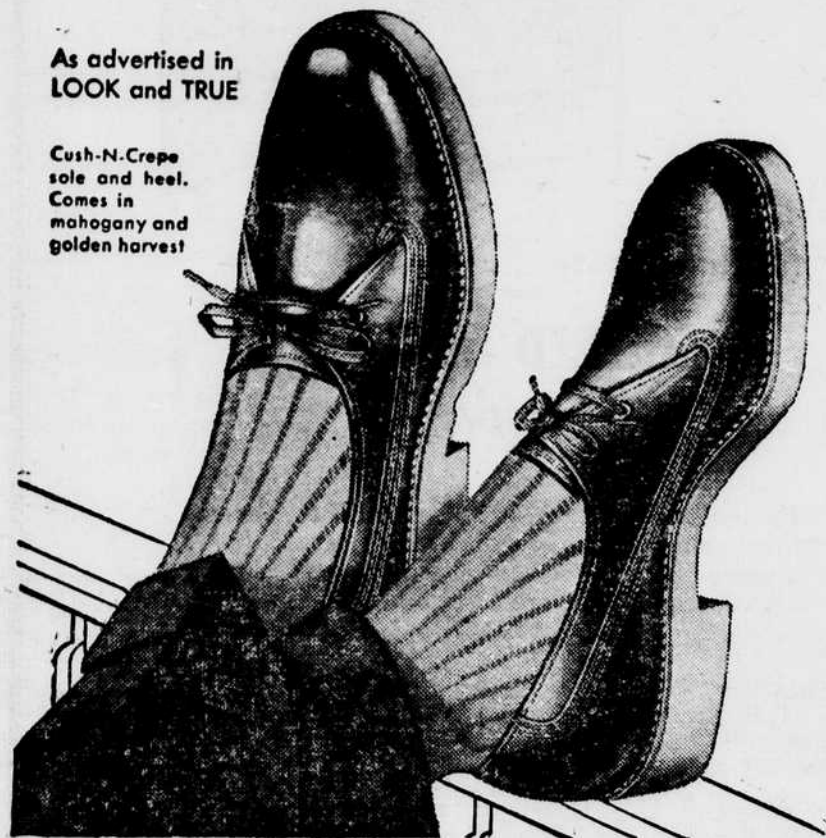
