

Seniors to Hear Pastor; 1300 to Receive Degrees

Rev. Robert James McCracken, pastor of the Riverside Church in New York City, N. Y. will be the speaker at the June 15 commencement exercises to be held at 2:30 p.m. in McArthur court.

"The Peril of Conformity" will be the title of Rev. McCracken's talk, which will be followed by the conferring of degrees by President H. K. Newburn.

About 1000 students will receive baccalaureate degrees this June and approximately 300 will get advanced degrees, according to Clifford L. Constance, registrar. This does not include those graduating from the University of Oregon medical or dental schools in Portland.

Flowers and Ferns

Immediately preceding the commencement exercises will be the flower and fern procession followed by the student and faculty procession. The latter procession will be the same as the 75th anniversary procession held Nov. 2.

The flower and fern procession is sponsored by the Oregon Alumni association with senior women and alumni groups taking part. Each house is asked by the association to send its past president and the girls with the best scholastic average, although every senior woman may take part in the procession.

Breakfast for Women

The annual June breakfast for senior women, honoring this year's graduates and the graduates of the class of 1902, will be held June 14 at 8 a.m. in the Student Union.

Class reunions will also be a feature of commencement week-end with the classes of 1902, 1912, 1917 and 1927 meeting on campus. The half-century club, composed of alumni who attended the University 50 or more years ago will hold their annual reunion.

Alumni Luncheon

A University luncheon for all alumni classes will be held in the Student Union ballroom, Saturday, June 14 at noon.

Following the luncheon alumni will hold receptions and tours of the campus and that evening class dinners will be held in downtown hotels.

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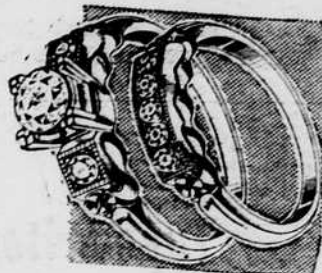

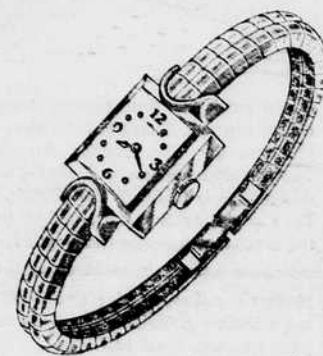
