A hopeful squad of 37 Oregon footballers boarded a bus for Portland this morning and will fly to Los Angeles for the season opener with the powerful UCLA Bruins. This Saturday at 2 p.m. in the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum the Webfoots will get their first taste of battle.

The Bruins, coached by Red Sanders, are rated strong Rose Bowl contenders and have been installed as 20 point favorites. Paul Cameron, swivel-hipped junior tailback, will be the big gun in the UCLA single-wing attack. Six-foot-five University of Oregon's 1952-53 inch end Ernie Stockert, an all-American candidate, will be the principle target for Cameron's deadly passing.
