

Bibler Cartoon Sales Begin Here Monday

"Little Man on Campus" books, containing over 90 pages of Dick Bibler's Worthal creations, will be on sale for \$1 at the Co-op and Student Union Monday.

Dick Bibler's "Little Man on Campus" cartoons are carried in the Oregon Daily Emerald and in 21 daily and 96 weekly school papers. The cartoon title was suggested by Gordon A. Sabine, dean of the journalism school here.

Bibler has studied education at Colorado State college, received

his master of fine arts degree from the University of Kansas and has studied at Stanford University, preparing to teach.

Some 200 copies of the books are on hand, and 500 more have been ordered by Sigma Delta Chi, national professional journalism fraternity, which is handling the sales.

Sales will be held from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday in the Co-op and at the main desk of the Student Union.

Buttons Boost Pogo's Fan Club; Give Ike and Adlai Competition

Eisenhower and Stevenson have had their competition from the third major candidate boosted "to a fare thee well" on the Oregon campus because of the efforts of one student.

The Pogo buttons are here.

The "I Go Pogo" buttons, plugging the popular—especially with college students—comic strip character, who is now a presidential candidate in the strip, have been available in the co-op since Monday, at no charge—free.

They were placed there by Joe Harden, senior in architecture, who ordered them from the New York Post corp., publishers of the Walt Kelly strip.

Harden said he had read in a Collier's magazine article about Pogo that there was a University of Oregon fan club, but he has been unable to find any indication of one. "I decided I'd start a one-man Pogo fan club myself," Harden, a counselor in Alpha hall, said.

So Harden ordered 1000 buttons.

He got them Monday morning, and tried handing them out as he passed people on the street. That didn't work too well, so he placed them in a box in the co-op with a sign advertising them. Also, some buttons were distributed by him in the Student Union fishbowl.

Wednesday afternoon they were all gone.

Harden says he plans to order some more, and they should arrive within about two weeks.

Included in the strip are such characters as these:

"P. T. Bridgeport," a circus manager, who is responsible for Pogo's candidacy in the strip. Bridgeport talks in circus type, with hand pointers pointing in toward his speech from each side in the strip balloons;

"Ol Albert, the Aligator—handsome, brilliant an' modest to a fare thee well;"
