# Raschi Tosses Three-hit Game

NEW YORK (AP) — New York Yankee power asserted itself Thursday as the defending world champions thumped the Brooklyn Dodgers, 7 to 1, at Ebbets field and evened the 1952 World Series at one game apiece.

The Yankees finally broke through a scrambling Carl Erskine and his successor, Billy Loes, for five runs in the sixth inning to clinch the game. The big blow was a three-run homer by spunky Billy Martin.

Veteran Vic Raschi handled the pitching chores for the New Yorkers—and admirably. Raschi allowed only three hits, walked five and struck out eight. All three Brooklyn hits came in the third inning when the National league champions scored their only run. After Roy Campanella singled to score the Brooklyn run in the third, Raschi retired 12 straight batters before walking Pinch-Hitter Rocky Nelson with two out in the seventh. Never after the third was the 33-year old righthander in any sore of trouble.

## Brooks Take Lead

Brooklyn's run, fashioned on singles by Pee Wee Reese, Duke Snider and Campanella, gave the Dodgers a short-lived 1 to 0 lead.

Seldom has a University of Oregon football squad made the 400 mile journey to Moscow, Ida. with any grave doubts about its ability to give the University of Idaho Vandals anything short of a sound shellacking.

The Webfoots invade Idaho's Neale stadium Saturday afternoon at 2 p.m. in a Pacific Coast conference game—and Coach Len Casanova is mighty worried. First string Halfback Ted Anderson and Right End Ron Lyman remained in Eugene when the Ducks, 37 strong, left for the Inland Empire last night. Both Anderson and Lyman were injured last Saturday in Portland.

"Our man power problem is acute. We can't afford to lose any more players," Casanova warned. "It will be Idaho's homecoming and they'll be up for us."

Before departing, the Oregons ran through a snappy early afternoon signal drill and no-contact scrimmage. The Ducks left via train for Portland and were to take another out of the Rose city and arrive in Pullman, Wash. at 9 a.m.

Farrell Albright, the Milwaukie soph who nearly raced all the way on a kickoff return against Nebraska, was due to get Anderson's assignment. Wayne Johnson will replace the injured Lyman. Otherwise the Duck lineup will remain the same as that used against the Cornhuskers.

Fearing the doughty Vandal defensive line, the Ducks must rely on their vaunted air game, with Hal Dunham and George Shaw slated to do most of the pitching. Albright, Tom Elliot and Tom Novikoff, the starting offensive left half, right half and full back, will do most of whatever running the Ducks undertake. Figuring that a point might well mean the difference, Cas had Novikoff working overtime on after TD shots.

Casanova is wary of the beefy Idaho line, calling it "one of the toughest from tackle to tackle that we'll meet all year." As to their split T offense, the greying former Orange Bowl mentor said: "Much of their attack is concentrated on down the middle punching with men like Jay Buhler and Flip Kleffner carrying the ball." Buhler, on the other hand, is a pretty tough number to handle on the end sweeps, too.
