Ike Asks Decentralized Land, Power Program

General Eisenhower accused President Truman of advocating a "whole hog federal policy". In a speech Monday at the Republican rally in Seattle Ike called for decentralization of land reclamation and water power development programs.

The general declared that he favors the full use of private resources plus a local, state, and federal partnership in the Pacific Northwest. Eisenhower criticized the Democrats for what he called using land reclamation and power development to increase and perpetuate their own power in Washington. He asserted that the Democrats seek a federal monopoly over hydroelectric power development throughout the nation.

He explained that the whole hog theory is that the federal government must own and control as many resources as it can lay its hands on, adding that this is a corruption of the federal and state division of powers upon which the United States was built.

Addressing trainside audiences in Washington, Eisenhower also charged that Truman generally was dishing out a lot of sheer bunk. The general said further that President Truman is firing blanks at him.

Communists Hit Korean Front

The Communist troops have attacked across two-thirds of the Korean battlefield in the biggest combined assault in many months. The Red forces were driven back almost everywhere. Intense fighting for some minor hill positions continued for several hours.

The Chinese opened the floodgates north of the reservoir in an assault on two major hill positions northwest of Chorwan. The Allied positions on the heights were attacked by 4,000 Red soldiers after letting water course around the hills.

The attackers were forced back by the Allied soldiers fighting with grenades, fists, and even stones.

The Communists also attacked marine defenses at numerous points in the West and seized a new hill north of Korangpo. South Korean marines supported by tanks fought all night to defend an outpost.

Reds Term Ike 'Imperialistic'

The nineteenth congress of the Soviet Union Communist party described General Eisenhower as an "imperialist who barks in vain at the Lithuanian people". The attack on Ike was delivered by the secretary general of the Lithuanian Communist party who referred to Eisenhower's remarks to the American Legion convention, where he talked about liberating the people of the Baltic states.

This was the first time the name of either of the presidential candidates had been mentioned on the Communist congress floor. It came in the course of debate which followed the keynote speech delivered last night by Georgi Malenkov. Malenkov several times attacked President Truman.

The secretary general said that the people of Soviet Lithuania can't be turned back from the path they are pursuing.

Campus Vote On Election Set for Oct. 22

The constitution committee of the ASUO senate decided Monday that the date of the referendum vote regarding the freshman class election will be held Wednesday, Oct. 22.

Helen Jackson Frye, ASUO vice-president and in charge of elections, said that the date of the election will be subject to the approval of the senate when it meets Thursday evening. The cost of the election will also be considered, she added.

The amendment will provide that "freshman elections shall take place after the fifth and prior to the eighth week of fall term except for the academic year 1952-53 when the election shall be held after the fifth week and prior to the tenth week of fall term."

If the amendment passes the constitution committee plans on having the freshman class election during the week after Homecoming. The date, according to Mrs. Frye, will be Friday, Nov. 14.

Farley Wants 'Whole Story'

The former Democratic National chairman James Farley called on the nation newspapers to demand a disclosure of Senator Nixon's finances. Farley said in a radio broadcast that the Republican vice-presidential nominee did not tell the whole story in his account of his finances. "I don't think he can get away with it," declared Farley.

The Air Force said that the disability payments to Republican Senator William Jenner of Indiana are being held up temporarily, pending an investigation. Jenner, a former Air Force captain, has denied any impropriety. He said that he suffered an eye ailment while being in service and feared that he might become blind.

Senators Attacked

President Truman, campaigning in Utah, attacked the senatorial supporters of General Eisenhower and declared that he does not believe that the American people will elect as president a man who would "surrender to Taft, McCarthy, Jenner and Kem". Earlier Truman told another whistlestop audience that it would be a tragedy to elect Eisenhower, since the general would not know what to do in the White House.

UN Army Talk Set

A United Nations committee suggested to the U.N. assembly the recruiting of a 60,000 men strong United Nations Volunteer army to fight aggression. The proposal has been sent to the Assembly for full debate and is expected to run into sharp Russian objections. The United States is lukewarm to the project.
