

Columbia Paper Denounces Ike, Sets Off Student, Faculty Reaction

An editorial in Columbia university's student newspaper, the Columbia Spectator, denouncing the presidential campaign of its president-on-leave, Dwight Eisenhower started a chain reaction after its publication Wednesday.

The editorial, signed by eight students including the editor, de-

scribed the Eisenhower campaign as a "great disillusionment" and added "the hopes of Americans who once believed in Eisenhower's great crusade have now been shattered." It announced support for Democratic candidate Adlai Stevenson.

Some students immediately set

up a table proclaiming "I Like Ike" at the steps of the administration building. Others said the editorial did not represent campus opinion against the university president.

Thursday, following the paper's statement, more than 100 profes-

sors and instructors met and voted into action the "Columbia Faculty Volunteers for Stevenson." Professor Charles Frankel suggested that the organization adopt as one of its slogans, "Keep Ike for Columbia," or "Don't Let Them Take Him Away."
