Hale Kane Drubs Barrister Inn; Pi Phis Tip DUs

Hale Kane leaped, and bounded over Barrister Inn, 42-2, and French hall pushed over Sherry Ross, 27-0, during the intra-mural touch football tiffs Thursday. French's win sets them up to play Merrick for the League Six championship. Barrister Inn is the first team to score on Hale Kane.

Gove Scores

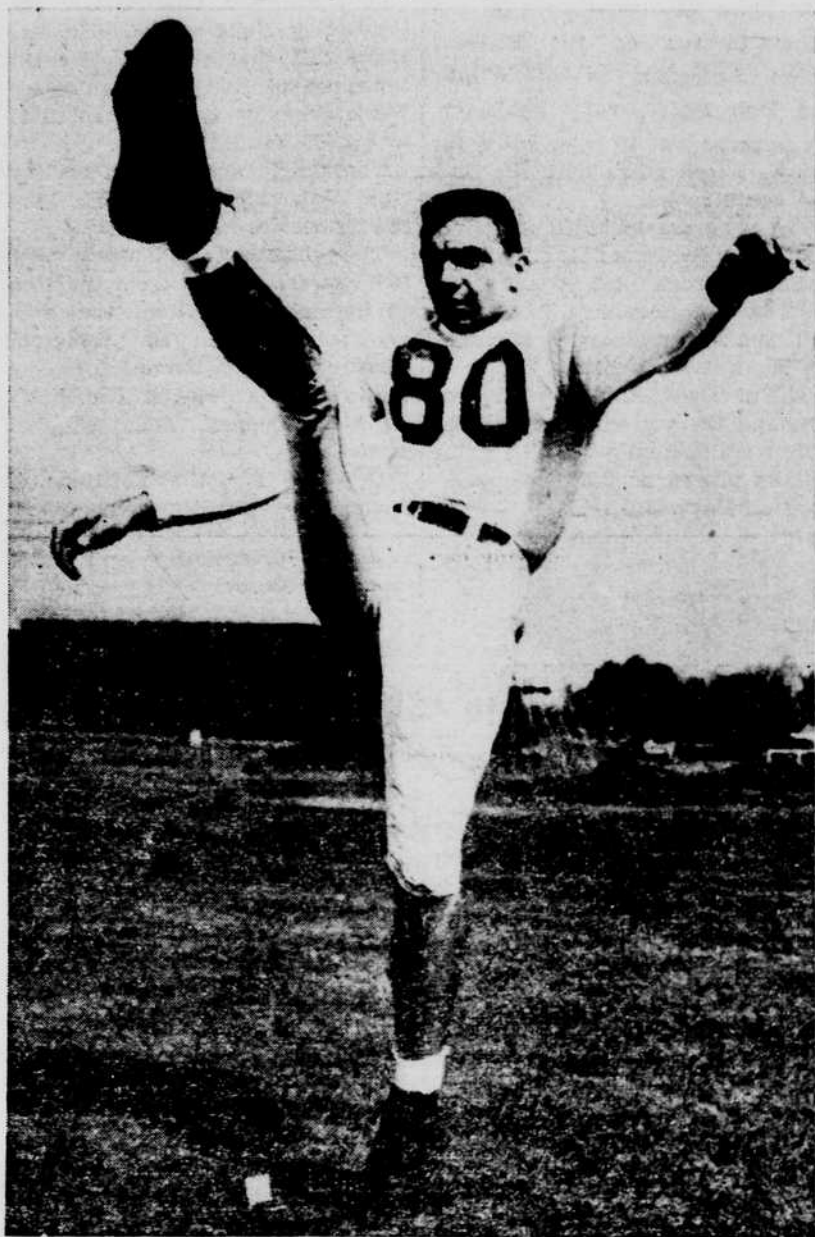

U. kickoff, passed to Greco, who passed back, then streaked 40 yards to score. The final tally was made when they scored another TD on a pass play late in the fourth.

Alpha Tau Omega pushed ahead of Phi Kappa Psi to finish 13-6. The ATO's won their victory in sky-rocketing pass plays, most of which were operated by Dave Hall, Vic Souvenir, Ken Wagner, as well as ATO's Bottler and Mathews.

Paced by the passing of Joe Segura, Sigma Nu had little trouble defeating Kappa Sigma, 20-0. The first score came as Segura flipped a short pass to Briot, who ran sixty yards for the initial score. Another Segura pass was good to Tom Swalm to give the Sigma Nu aggregation a 12-0 halftime lead. Taking up where they left off, the Sigma Nus marched to the Kappa Sig goal line early in the third period, but couldn't push it across. RIFE WITH INJURIES

Californians Overwhelming Choice; Ducks Bank Upset Plans on Passes

The kingpins of West Coast football, the University of California Golden Bears, led by their three touchdown terrors, Johnny Olszewski, Bill Powell and Don Johnson, roll into Portland's Multnomah stadium Saturday afternoon for a Pacific Coast conference setto with the University of Oregon's power-sapped Ducks.

Odds-makers have labled the Bears anywhere from a three to five touchdown favorite for the 1:30 p.m. game, despite Oregon's astounding showing

last year at Berkeley when they battled the rough and tumble Bears to a 26-28 fare-thee-well. But a rash of injuries, the worst outbreak Len Casanova has faced since he took over the reigns of the Webfoots, has shrunk the Duck's upset hopes to a minimum.

Frosh Entertain Beaver Rooks At Hayward Field

Freshman gridders open the season today as host to the Rooks of Oregon State.

Game time is 2:30 and admission is by student body card. Hayward field is the location unless a deluge changes the field into a pond, in which case it will be played on the adjoining practice field.

"You can never predict a frosh game with any accuracy," laughed Bill Bowerman who is now in his fifth year as their head mentor. Last year the Ducklings finished with a 4-0 record, two of the wins being credited against the aggregation from Corvallis.

The starting offensive lineup will work from the standard T-formation. The opening platform will be Ted Overton, LE; Lon Stiner, LT; George Mutschler, LG; Art Weber, C; Troy Bellah, RG; Harry Johnson, RT; Doyle Higdon, RE; Johnny Keller, QB; Meb Buchanan, RH; Larry Ross, FB; and Dick Pavlat, LH.

From their halfback positions two Canadians, John Wyatt and Bob Reid, are slated to add additional punch to the locals attack. Defensive linemen Jim McGinnis and Jerry Nelson are counted on heavily to stop the Rooks' ground gaining potential.

They Won't Play

Definitely out of action will be Chuck Laird, the 212 pound line-backer who hails, ironically, from Berkeley, California; Dick Stoutt, 220 pound center from Milwaukee, who will rejoin the club next week; and Pat O'Brien, 193 pound tackle from San Rafael, Calif., out for the season. Also on the injury list is Tom Elliot, 191 pound senior half-back from Los Angeles.

Ron Lyman, offensive right end; Ted Anderson, starting left half; and Ben Johnson, defensive end will be operating at half speed only. Lyman, a brilliant star during spring practice, has fallen short of the mark because of an elbow injury; Anderson had an ankle hurt and Johnson has a sore shoulder. Starting in place of Lyman at right end will be Jim Jones, who has seen little offensive work this year. Jones is a 189 pound sophomore from Portland.
