## Eisenhower Says Adlai Hits Harlem Demo Untutored As 125,000 Cheer

(P)—Dwight D. Eisenhower, the standard bearer of the Republicans, jeered Monday at the assertion of Governor Stevenson that the place to settle the Korean war is in Moscow.

Eisenhower declared while addressing an audience in Pittsburgh Monday night: "It betrays again the mentality that is completely untutored in the tough business of world relations. It is the cry of a man whose formula for dealing with Soviet aggression has been openly stated in the terms of 'give and concede'."

He also promised to call a halt to what he refers to as the treadmill prosperity for workers whose pay raises are cancelled out by higher prices and taxes.

Eisenhower also said that Stevenson called last May for a prolonged public discussion of what it will be necessary to concede to Russia. The Republican nominee added that that is the language that invites war.

He blamed what he called "Washington interference" for a coal strike and for the steel strike last spring. Eisenhower charged that the administration has engaged in what he calls "political double-dealing" with labor and its problems.

The Republican candidate declared again that he will make the journey to Korea if elected president. He said that he feels that if a close study of our military and political problems in Korea can save the life of a single American soldier and bring peace of mind to a single American family he must make that journey.

Eisenhower put in a bid for Pennsylvania votes Monday, talking in Philadelphia, Lancaster, Harrisburg, Altoona, and Johnstown.

(P)—Democratic presidential candidate Stevenson said tonight that his Republican rival, Dwight D. Eisenhower, speaks with every voice in the Republican party except his own.

Stevenson made the remark to a cheering street audience in Harlem. Police estimate that 125,000 persons crowded in front of the Hotel Theresa to hear Stevenson after 75,000 persons greeted him at a Harlem railroad station and lined the short route to the speaking place.

Stevenson chided Eisenhower for conducting what the Democrat called a "strange campaign" and for taking what Stevenson termed "bewildering variety of positions" on the major campaign issues. Stevenson said he does not change his ideas according to his itinerary.

Eisenhower spoke from the same place in Harlem Saturday, when police said he addressed 15,000 to 20,000 persons.

Meanwhile President Harry Truman accused Eisenhower of dishonesty in a recapitulation of developments in Korea. Eisenhower has said that the state department is responsible for the withdrawal of American occupation troops from Korea in 1948.

Eisenhower has called this a part of the terrible record which led to the outbreak of war. Monday night President Truman declared while campaigning in Indiana for Stevenson: "At the time this recommendation was made, the Republican candidate was chief of the staff of the army. As a member of the joint chiefs of staff, he was responsible for this recommendation."

"I say, too, his effort to shift responsibility to the department of state for a recommendation which was his, originally, is thoroughly dishonest," added the President.

## Battle of the Hills Still Rages In Korea; Marines Win 'Hook'

(P)—The battle of the hills continued to rage in Korea Monday night. United States Marines won back a position called "The Hook" on the Western front ten miles northeast of Panmunjom.

The marines were knocked off the hill earlier by an attack of 1,500 Chinese Reds. They destroyed the last Red resistance early Tuesday morning.

In the center of the front the

South Korean troops regained all of Pinpoint hill after having been forced off by 750 Chinese Reds.

(P)—Prisoners seized control of one of the cell blocks of Menard State prison in Illinois Monday and held a prison lieutenant and six guards as hostages.

Warden Jerome Munie called off plans to storm the cell block with 60 armed guards after the rioting prisoners threatened to toss the hostages off a 50-foot level. No immediate demands were made by the prisoners.

Twenty state policemen were at the scene and reinforcements were coming. There was an uprising at the Menard prison a month ago.

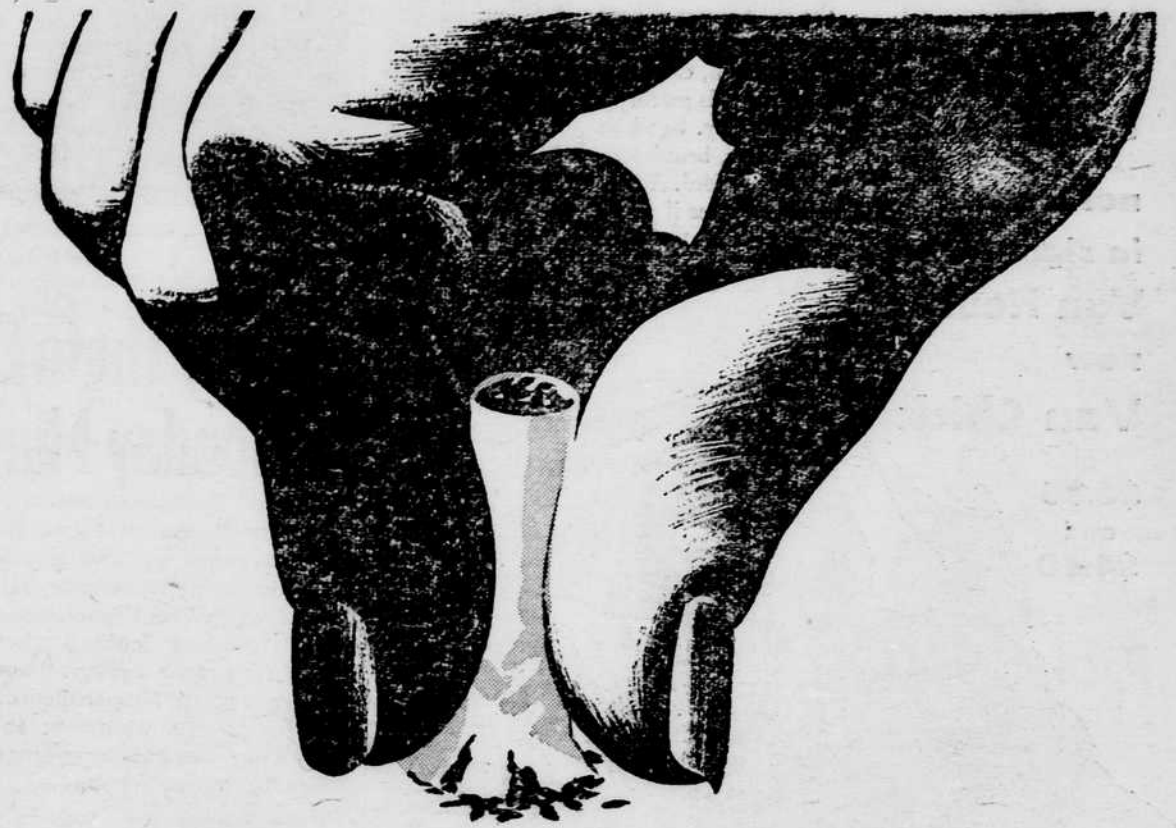
