Webfoots Recall 1951 Trouncing

McCormick Tops Scorer

McCormick whom Vern Sterling Oregon's line coach who scouted COP, claims to be one of the best backs on the coast.

Tom "the Atom Bomb" is the team's leading scorer with five touchdowns, is tops in kickoff returns with eight for 167 yards, and is second in pass receiving with nine catches for 114 yards. He is also the best in rushing offense with 434 yards and a 5.6 yards per carry average. Another letterman, Hank Welch at left half, rounds out a dangerous running trio.

As if this isn't enough, Coach Len Casanova stated that the COP passing game is 100% improved over last year. Quarterback Roy Ottoson, who has already passed for more yards than did Doug Scovil, COP's leading passer last year, has connected for 49 in 94 attempts for 576 yards, four touchdowns, and a .521 percentage.

Twice Victor

COP has lost three out of its five games but two of these were to California and powerful San Diego Navy. The other loss was to San Jose State, a traditional rival, who won the game in the final 24 seconds. The two Tiger victims are Utah State and Texas Tech.

After a poor showing against Montana, Oregon fans can only hope that a week's practice has worked to sharpen up the tackling and blocking. It will take more than George Shaw's passing to keep Oregon in the game Saturday.

Monte Brethauer and Ron Lyman will return to the lineup to help the passing attack. Emery Barnes may be back in top shape to give much needed defensive end strength. Dick Stout, recently recovered from a broken ankle suffered during pre-season practice may be able to see action at defensive tackle.

Ted Anderson will be able to play despite a broken nose he received in practice this week. Hal Dunham may start at quarterback with Shaw in at halfback. COP had trouble handling the swing passes of San Jose State so Casanova will want as many good receivers in the lineup as possible in hopes of exploiting the COP
