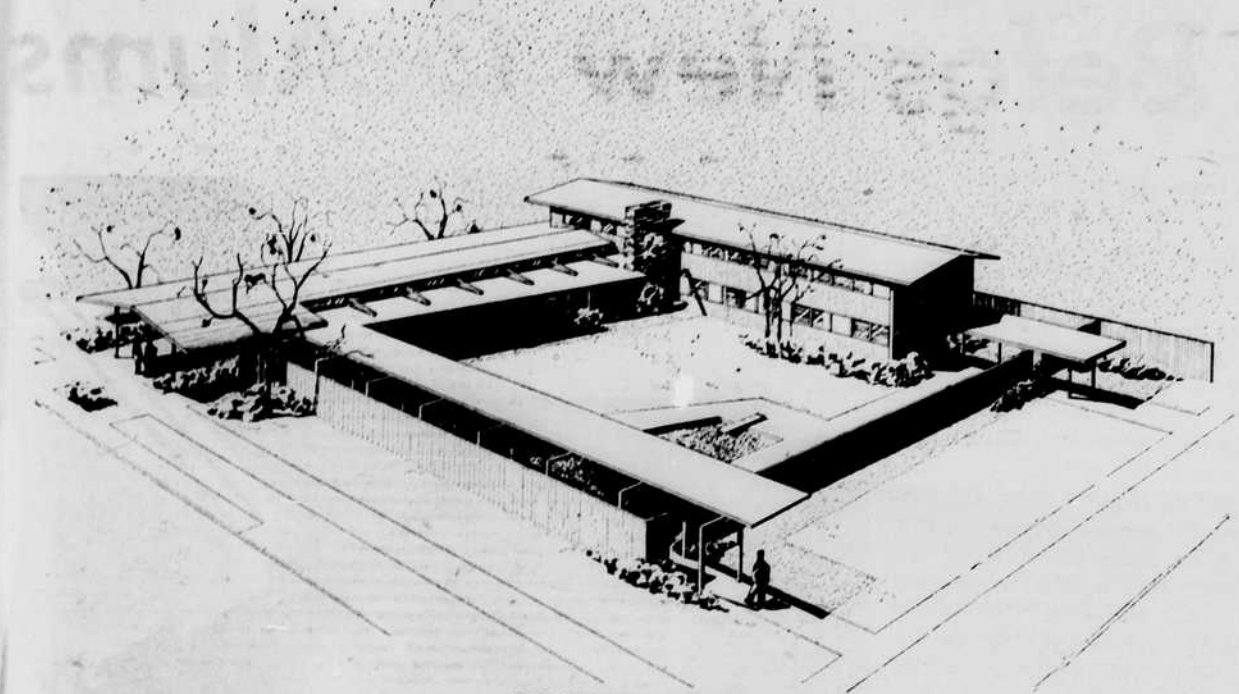




DU HOUSE PLAN

Campus Houses Show Face-Liftings; Two Plan New Homes for Next Year

DU, FIJI SET FALL MOVING

Alumni returning to the University of Oregon this weekend will find many changes along fraternity row and beyond. Where there has been no face lifting, chances are members will show-off blueprints for new houses or extensive renovations.

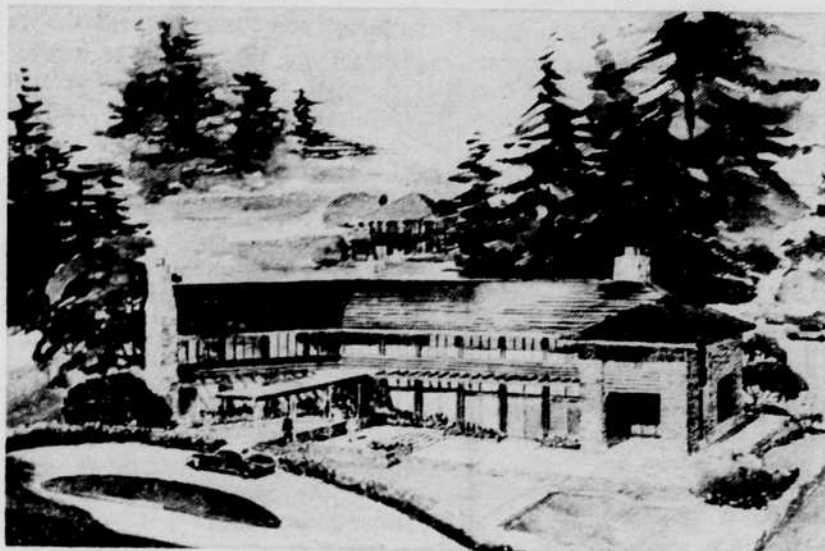
Two of the fraternities in the latter classification, Delta Upsilon and Phi Delta Gamma, plan to start construction this year with the new houses scheduled for occupancy next fall.

Delta Upsilon's plans call for an L shaped house of modernistic design covering about four city lots at 18th Ave. and Patterson St. The new home of the DU's will cost \$100,000 and include an enclosed patio and backyard. The building is to be two stories high on one side for the study and sleeping rooms and one story for the kitchen and living and dining rooms.

The Fiji house will also be on 18th, at Harris St. Alumni and active members have been working together to formulate financial plans for the house which will cost \$120,000. The building was designed by Earl Heitschmidt, Oregon class of '19, member of Phi Gamma Delta and past president of the California Architects association. Features of the house will be a 60-seat dining room, oak-paneled lounges, guest rooms, indirect lighting and air conditioning.

The house will be surrounded by a paved terrace, a concrete tennis court and a parking area 80 by 170 feet.

Recarpeting throughout the house, a freshly painted interior and newly upholstered furniture will greet returning alumni at Alpha Chi Omega. Extensive redecorating also took place at Alpha Delta Pi whose alumni completely redecorated first floor as a gift to the present members.

Remodeling of the kitchen and redecorating of the sun room were the major changes at Alpha Phi.

Alpha Xi Delta received a complete face lifting. Two large shrubs were removed from the front of the house and the brick entrance widened. The exterior has been painted Dover gray and Nottingham red with black dormers. The interior was also painted and wall-to-wall carpets laid on the first floor.

Landscaping received major attention at Delta Zeta. Trees were removed from around the house and the back yard is being landscaped. On the inside, the pledge room and dining room were repainted.

An addition was made to the Kappa Kappa Gamma house which gives the Kappa's an enlarged sleeping porch and two new rooms. Through a general re-shuffling of space five new rooms were added along with a lounge and a pantry. The front porch was enlarged and the exterior of the house repainted.

A new basketball and volleyball court, the gift of the Mothers' club, is the latest addition at Phi-Delta Theta. Phi Kappa Psi painted

the exterior of their house and redecorated the party room.

The entire first floor at Phi Sigma Kappa was painted and papered. The Phi Sig's are also planning to revamp the front of the house.

Pi Kappa Alpha is planning a new house in the future, but no definite date has been set. This weekend parents of the members will judge the fraternity's room painting contest.

Sigma Alpha Mu has a newly completed chapter room. Drapes, the gift of the Portland Mothers' club have been hung in the front room.

Members of Sigma Phi Epsilon also have a new basketball court with a different twist, green cement. The fraternity also installed a complete new stainless steel kitchen.

At Theta Chi, home of the football team before the opening of fall term, members are planning to repaint and replaster the house.

Two fraternities purchased new houses this summer. They are Pi Kappa Phi, who moved to 740 E 15th, and Lambda Chi Alpha, who moved to 650 E. 11th.
