Sartie's Play 'No Exit' To Be Shown As UO Theater Bonus Production

Four University dramatists will perform Jean-Paul Sartie's philosophical drama, "No Exit", Nov. 21 and 22 as the first bonus attraction for University theater season ticket holders.

This highly experimental production will be read in the Laughton style by Horace W. Robinson, director of the University theater; Frederick J. Hunter, assistant director; Mrs. Mary Krenk, a graduate of Oregon and active in Eugene Very Little theater work, and Beverly Brunton, senior in speech. Miss Brunton won the award for the best actress of the 1951-52 University theater season for her role in "The Madwoman of Chailiot."

This play has never before been done in the western area, and has rarely been done anywhere. There-

fore, it will be new material to most theater goers.

The story deals with the souls of a man and two women condemned to hell, who, instead of being subjected to the punishment fires, are sealed together in a small, bare room for eternity.

Sartie is probably best known as the "high priest" of the philosophy, "Existentialism". He is famous for his philosophical and psychological writing which includes a number of texts, one or two novels and approximately five plays.

This production will be open only to University theater 1952-53 season ticket holders. Because of the

limited seating capacity, only one reserved seat ticket will be allowed for each season ticket held. No admissions will be sold.
