Sidney W. Little, dean of the school of architecture and allied arts, returned to Eugene Friday from a five months stay in Europe. He left the campus last June on sabbatical leave to study the teaching and administration methods of architecture and the major crafts in Italy and throughout Southern Europe.

His headquarters were in Florence, Italy while he did his research work. His observations and study included the methods of design in architecture and the work being done in weaving, ceramics and other crafts. Little's work paralleled the major studies in this field offered at the University.

F. A. Cuthbert, head of the landscape department, took over Little's position during the latter's leave of absence.
