Holland has been using a face guard for the past two weeks, and it is probable he will be using the protection again this weekend.

Now sporting a five game conference win streak, the Ducks have a solid hold on second spot at the three-fourths mark, three games above third place Idaho and four ahead of Oregon State. One win in Seattle would give the Oregon five at least a tie for second in the final standings.




