### Historian to Talk About Socialism

A man who was imprisoned by the Nazis for his part in a plot to kill Adolph Hitler, Gerhard Ritter, German historian and professor, will visit the University Sunday through Tuesday under the sponsorship of the University lectures committee.

Ritter will deliver a University lecture Monday at 8 p.m. in the Dads' lounge of the Student Union on "The Roots of National Socialism and the Problem of Modern Mass Democracy." In his talk Ritter will discuss the problems of present-day Germany and Central Europe countries.

Tuesday noon he will speak to the Eugene Rotary club on "The Problems of German Youth." Ritter's current project is doing research under the educational exchange program of the State department on the history of national socialism.

Wednesday Ritter will lecture at Oregon State college and on Thursday at Portland State college.

# Phi Delts Tip ATO for Title

In the tightest track meet ever run at the University of Oregon, the Phi Delts squeezed past ATO, 34 1/6 to 33 5/6, Wednesday afternoon to win the intramural track championship.

The race went right down to the last event, the relay, before the winner was decided. In this event, Phi Delta Theta's squad, Farrell Albright, Dean Van Leuven, Dick Mausshardt and Dick Zimmerman, came out ahead.

The high jump was the most tightly contested event with two men, Van Leuven and Ron Lyman, ATO, tying for first and Monte Brethauer, ATO, Zimmerman, and Dan Hendrickson, Phi Delt, deadlocking for third spot.

The pole vault was also hotly contested in the race for third. Dick Jones, ATO, and Don Gartrell, Phi Delt, tied for this place.

Two over-anxious ATO contestants were disqualified in the 40 yard dash for jumping the gun two times. After five false starts the event was finally run with Zimmerman winning for the Phi Delts in a time of 5 seconds flat.

Top scorer for the meet was Ron Lyman, ATO, who tied for first in the high jump, and picked up a second in the 40 yard hurdles.

Two Phi Delts had a first and a third each. Van Leuven tied for the top place in the high jump and got a third in the 40 yard hurdles. His teammate, Zimmerman, won the hurdles event and placed third in the high jump.

By winning the meet, the Phi Delts added to their intramural total and also earned a leg toward the Les Steers trophy, held the two previous years by Alpha Tau Omega.

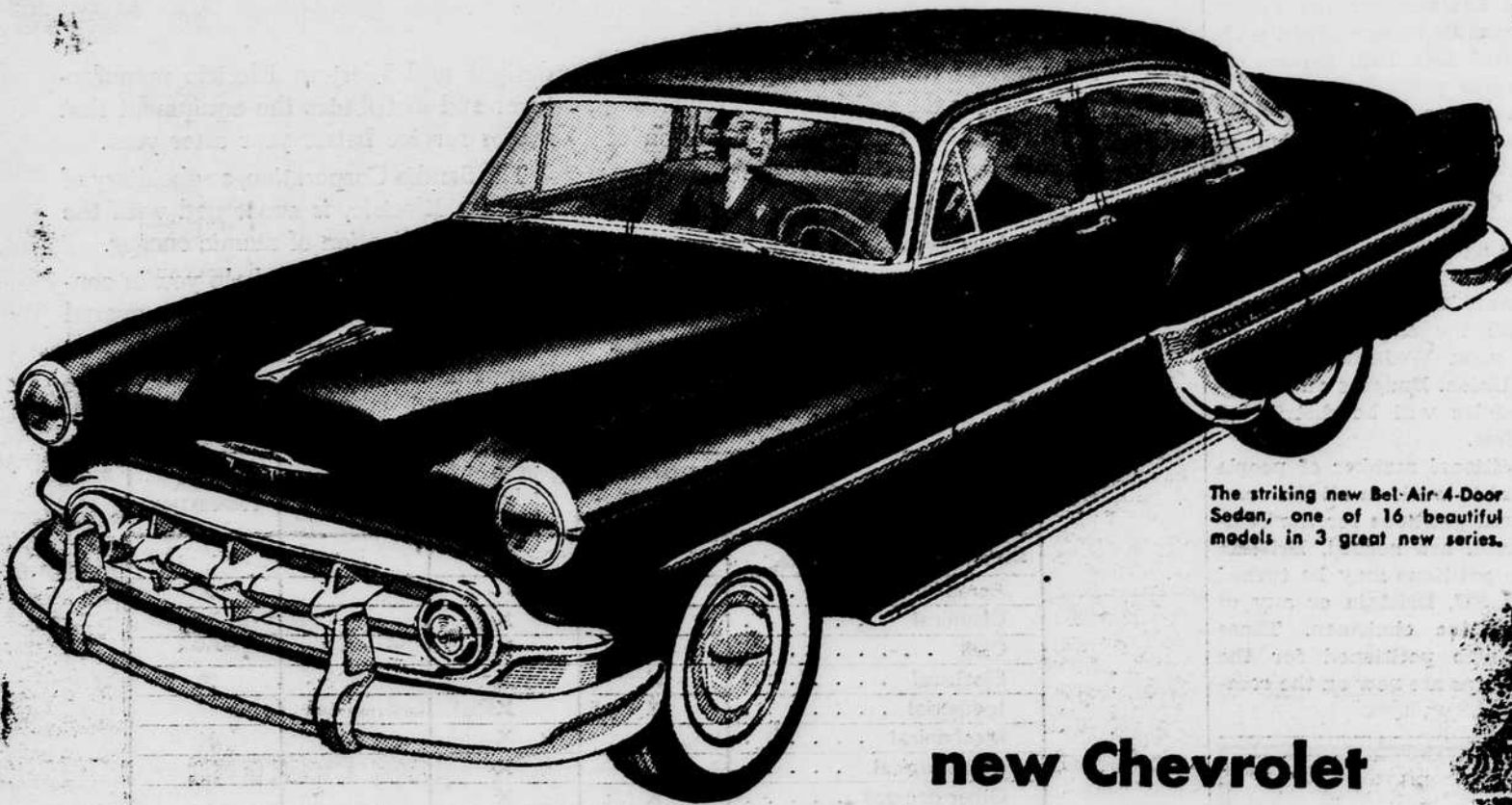
