Campus honoraries and professional fraternities number some 44, excluding other organizations and activities. This category includes groups which pick members on an automatic or selective basis from schools or departments, from classes, or from students with a particular interest.

These groups differ widely in requirements, structure, and emphasis. The most selective are Phi Beta Kappa, liberal arts; Sigma Xi, science; and Order of the Coif,

Perhaps the most famous of these is Phi Beta Kappa, national scholastic honorary. Members are selected in the spring, except for the Senior Six, on the basis of outstanding scholarship and liberal arts background. This year's Senior Six, picked fall term as the first six seniors to make Phi Beta each year, are Pat Ward, Chris Williams, Helen Jackson Frye, Mary Dorris, Bill Norval, Vera Paugh.

Phi Beta Kappa officers are faculty members.
