To Meet Huskies Today

This afternoon the University of Oregon meets Washington's Huskies in the first game of a two game baseball series in which the Webfoots will be out to protect their league leadership in the Northern Division.

Huskies Last

The Huskies, who last year tied for the league championship are Phi Kaps, Campbell now resting in the basement. A whole host of veterans are missing from the 1952 squad, and Coach Warren Tappin is in the process of rebuilding his ball club.

Leading the Husky batsmen is Sam Mitchell, who was an all coast choice last year in the catcher's slot. Bill Reams, a right-handed sophomore, pitched the Washington nine to a 6-0 triumph over Idaho last week, and is expected to get the starting assignment on the mound today.

Coach Don Kirsch's Webfoot nine has posted three consecutive wins in conference play, and has compiled a hefty .308 team batting average, while the pitching staff has held the opposition to a meager .200 mark.

Livesay Leads Hitters

Pacing the Ducks at the plate is Co-Captain Jim Livesay with a brilliant .615 percentage. Others batting .300 or better are George Shaw, Don Siegmund, and Jim Delta Upsilon Johnson, Siegmund also leads the runs-batted-in column with four in the three contests.

Stan Dmochowsky, who hurled a three hitter against Washington State, is scheduled to start the contest for the Ducks. Norm Forbes and Bill Blodgett have also been credited with conference wins.

League Leading Ducks Huskies To Host Webfoots ND Dual Meet at Seattl

The Webfoot cindermen left to day for their second dual track meet of the season, with the University of Washington Huskies as their opponents. vault again as the Huskies have also promise to be weak in the low hurdles and far from outstanding

in the highs.

The Ducks may have a very difficult time in the mid-distances unless Anderson is in very good condition. In the 880 Washington's Red Vanderhoof is one of the best in the conference but he will have to beat Doug Clement to win and that isn't an easy job.

Jack Burney may be a contender in the 440 but Clement




has recorded the best time of the year in that event and Ted Anderson is also a consistent winner.

Oregon is weak and inexperienced in most of the field events but in the distance races it will be a matter of the Huskies first rate team against a strong bunch of Oregon runners.


Washington will feature Denny Meyer, one of the best distance men in their history in the two mile event and Bob Fornia, Northern Division champ in the mile.
