

# Ducks Face Pilots; Livesay Top Hitter

Oregon's Ducks went through hitting and fielding drills Monday in preparation for their non-league encounter with the Portland university Pilots at Howe field this afternoon at 3 p.m. Currently possessing a 10-game winning streak, the Webfoots will be out to increase their victory string at the expense of the visiting Pilots.

Excepting two later conference games with Oregon State, the game will be Oregon's last home appearance of the year.

Despite being held down somewhat by Washington pitchers, Centerfielder Jim Livesay is still the Ducks leading Northern division hitter with a .428 average—nine hits in 21 at bats. Following Livesay is Shortstop George Shaw with .333, Earl Averill, also with .333 and Leftfielder Ron Phillips with

.316. Firstbaseman Don Siegmund leads in runs scored with seven while Phillips has batted in the most runs, eight.

Leading the pitchers are Sophomore righthanders Bill Blodgett and Norm Forbes, each with perfect 2-0 records. Southpaw Stan Dmochowsky has the other Oregon conference win.

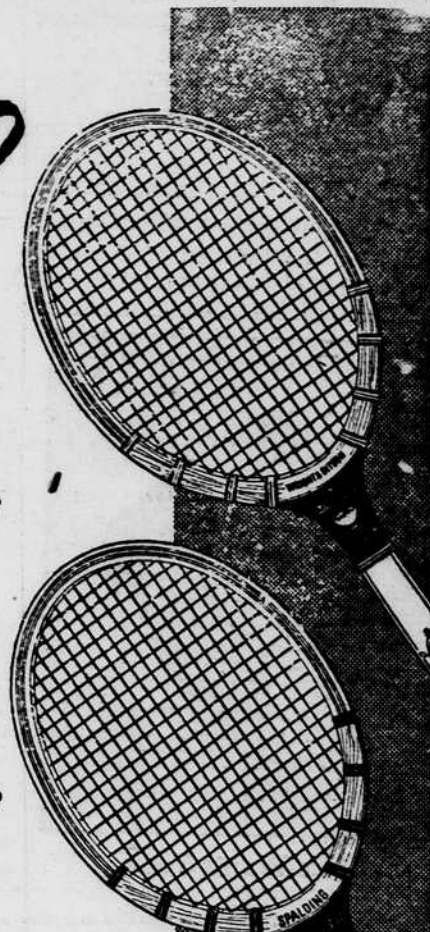
