Shakespearean Mood Comes To Audience

The delightful laughter, talk and singing around a king's banquet table of the Shakespearean era was shared, via tape recording, with Wednesday night's near-capacity crowd in the Browsing room.

It was the concert "An Evening's Revels" which was presented in Ashland during the last Shakespearean Festival and recorded by Don L. Hunter, head of the audio-visual department.

Mrs. Oattie Seybolt, associate professor of speech, related background information of the concert and set the mood for the appreciation of this type program. She recently visited many of the places in England connected with Shakespeare's writings which inspired this production.

Dialogue for the production was taken from plays of the Elizabethan period by William Shakespeare, Nicolas Udall, George Peele, Thomas Dekker, Beaumont and Fletcher, Thomas Heywood, Thomas Middleton, Ben Jonson, James Shirley, Claudius Hollybrand, and

Peter Erondell.

Madrigalists presented "Sing We And Chant It," "April Is In My Mistress' Face," "The Silver Swan and Shoot," "False Love," "I Care Not." Other Elizabethan works such as "Ayre," "Three Ricercari" and "The Coranto" were presented.

The concert was climaxed with Greensleeves, a famous old ballad presented by all the concert players using the tune which Shakespeare knew.
