

Webfoots Set For Spartan Contest

San Jose State Here Saturday

Sensing an opportunity to break their four game losing streak the University of Oregon football squad ran through a snappy workout Thursday afternoon.

Coach Len Casanova emphasized the importance of perfecting defensive formations in the final full practice session before Saturday's encounter on Hayward field against the San Jose State Spartans.

The Ducks, who have dropped four consecutive tussles since their opening victory over Nebraska, are very anxious to get back in the winning column.

In all of their losses the Webfoots have played on nearly even terms with their opponents but have time after time muffed golden scoring chances. Breaking this scoring drought is the main objective the Oregons have in mind for the Spartan tilt.

Winning over San Jose will be no easy chore, though. The Spartans have shown in their previous games this season that they are no pushover. Early in the season Coach Bob Bronsan's strong eleven smashed the Idaho Vandals, 34-7. Only last Saturday the Spartans gave California's highly-touted Bears a terrific struggle

before finally succumbing by a 34-14 margin.

From these scores it is quite apparent that the Ducks will have no easy time if they are to come out on the long end of the score against the visiting Californians.

Anchored by Jon Peterson, a 240-pound tackle, San Jose has one of the heftiest lines on the Pacific Coast. Just how well the Oregon running offense will go against this big forward wall is a question that the Duck coaching staff would like to know the answer to.

If the Webfoots find the Spartan line vulnerable to their rush-

ing thrusts, Dick James, Farrell Albright, and Dean Van Leuven will handle most of the ball-carrying assignments.

Should the running plays bog down, then Oregon will depend on the passing arms of George Shaw and Barney Holland to gain their yardage. Both Shaw and Holland have shown signs of greatness with their aerials this season but they have been seriously hampered by a lack of capable receivers to haul in their tosses.

When the Ducks line up for the 1:30 p.m. kickoff, Saturday, the starting eleven will probably read something like this: John Reed, left end; Hal Reeve, left tackle; Ken Sweitzer, left guard; Ron Pheister, center; Jack Patera, right guard; Keith Tucker, right tackle; Len Berrie, right end; George Shaw, quarterback; Dick James, left halfback; Farrell Albright, right halfback; and Dean Van Leuven, fullback.
