

Webfoots Defense, Pass For Trojans

Oregon's Ducks sharpened up on both offense and defense Wednesday afternoon as they prepared for the Saturday clash in Portland with the potent University of Southern California Trojans.

Most of the drill was spent on defense in an effort to stop the Trojan offense, which last week rolled up 34 points in whipping California, 34-20. Coach Len Cas-

Passes Click

A short offense workout followed the defense. Barney Holland and George Shaw, taking turns calling the signals, consistently hit their receivers with passes.

The Trojans will come to Portland with a host of good backs. George Bozanic and Landon Exley are the quarterbacks, Aramis Dandoy, Lindon Crow, and Des Koch are the halfbacks, and Harold Han and Leon Sellers handle fullback. Dandoy and Koch are both outstanding punters.

Southern Cal usually sticks to the ground, but Coach Jess Hill does have capable passers in Bozanic and Dandoy.

Dandoy Top Threat

Dandoy, an all-around back, is second in the conference in rushing with 366 yards, sixth in total offense with 531, second in punt average with an average of 40.9, and has scored four touchdowns. He also is tops in punt returns and ranks fifth in kickoff returns.

In team statistics USC is second in rushing offense, third in total offense, and first in rushing defense.

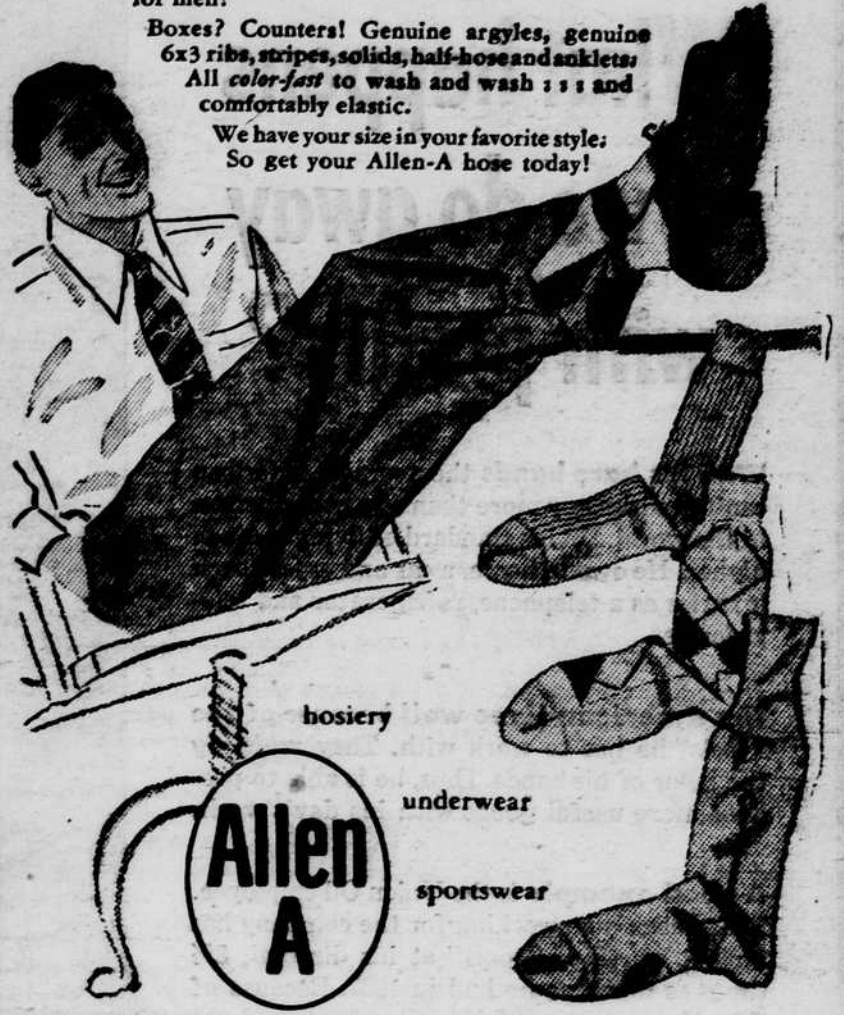
