> Garrett pitched for 324 yards last Saturday against Southern California, snapping the record of 308 set by Bob Waterfield, UCLA, against Idaho in 1942, boosting him into the PCC's total offense leadership and increasing his bulge as the leading passer.

> Receivers On Top, Too Meanwhile, his receivers moved farther on top, too, and his favorite three, Sam Morley, John Steinberg and Ron Cook now rank 1-2-3 in the PCC. Morley has 35 receptions in eight games for 461 yards and four touchdowns and needs 11 more to tie the PCC record of 46 (Ed Barker, Washington State, 1951.)

Garrett has completed 92 of 158 passes for 1360 yards and 13 touchdowns with only five interceptions. Sandy Lederman, Washington, is second with 73 completions, and Paul Larson, California, third, 62. If Garrett continues at his recent pace he could snap the PCC records of 15 TD passes (Bob Burkhart, WSC, 1951) and 60.9 per cent completions ... (Don ... Heinrich, Washington, 1950).
