## Terms of Ore.-USC Pact Emphasized

Students are requested not to participate in any raids or other activities likely to result in property damage or personal injury in connection with the Oregon State college game next Saturday, the office of student affairs announced Thursday.

The office of the director of men's affairs has had an agreement of long-standing with the office of the OSC dean of men. The terms of the agreement provide that students, individually and collectively, shall be liable for the costs of repairing any damage they might do at the other institution, and that any students apprehended in such pre-game activities will be suspended.

## WSSF Donor List Topped by Oregon

Oregon topped the list of 31 Northwestern colleges and junior colleges in contributions to the World Student Service Fund, according to a notice received this week. The WSSF drive was held on campus spring term.

A total of \$1,703.80 was collected, as compared to the \$1,958.98 which took first place for Oregon in 1952.

In second place with \$1,260 was the University of Washington. With a total of \$1,172.41, Oregon State college was third. Washington State college was fourth with \$937.44.

Approximately \$10,700 was collected from the 31 colleges reporting. This total was well over the \$9,217 donated by college students in 1952.
