WSSF Donor List Topped by Oregon

Oregon topped the list of 31 Northwestern colleges and junior colleges in contributions to the World Student Service Fund, according to a notice received this week. The WSSF drive was held on campus spring term.
A total of \$1,703.80 was collec-

ted, as compared to the \$1,958.98 which took first place for Oregon in 1952.

In second place with \$1,260 was the University of Washington. With a total of \$1,172.41, Oregon State college was third. Washington State college was fourth with \$937.44.

Approximately \$10,700 was collected from the 31 colleges reporting. This total was well over the \$9,217 donated by college students
