

Holland Sparks Ducks To Overtime Triumph

The Oregon Ducks, led by the sharp shooting eye of Barney Holland, defeated San Jose State 74-70 in a thrilling overtime pre-season basketball encounter at McArthur court last Saturday.

Oregon Wins; Whistles Toot

The only thing that disturbed the customers' sleep Friday night was the constant tooting of the officials' whistles. A small crowd turned out to see Oregon take a slow 75-63 decision over San Jose State.

A near record number of fouls kept the action at a minimum so neither team had a chance to show their ability. San Jose was responsible for 28 infractions, Oregon 24. Three San Jose players left via the foul route.

Barney Holland was tops in the scoring column for Oregon with 23 points. Buster Burgos, a speedy little guard, led the Spartans with 20.

In a game that was tied 11 times, the scoring was a see-saw event with the Spartans leading in first quarter scoring 12-11 and the Ducks heading the scoring 25-24 at the half time. In the third quarter scoring speeded up somewhat with each team scoring 20 counters and the Ducks still a one point leader, 45-44.

The final stanza ran in the most part much the same way as did the first three with San Jose taking over the lead with three minutes remaining and holding this lead up to Barney Holland's game tying two hander from 35 feet out, knotting the score at 67-67.

The five minute overtime was controlled by the Ducks as they opened the period with a long push shot by Ken Wegner and wound up the contest 74-70.

Leading the game scoring was San Jose's Carroll Williams who totaled 27 points. He was followed by Ken Wegner of Oregon who pushed in 23 and Ed Halberg with 16. On the foul route, both teams saw action. The Ducks lost Ed Halberg in the fourth stanza while the Spartans lost two players, Buster Burgos and Norm Ponti.

Norm Van Brocklin in Current Film

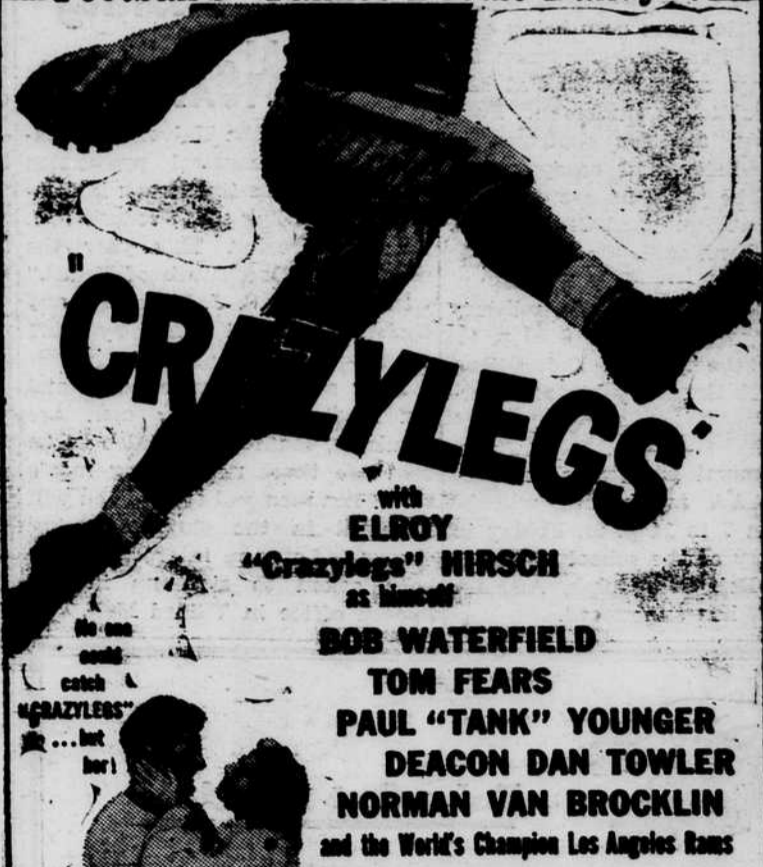
It is a rare thing when the life of a 29-year-old man still living is the basis of a movie and it is still rarer when that young man though not an actor is chosen to portray himself. But this is exactly what happened to Elroy (Crazylegs) Hirsch, famous football star with the Los Angeles Rams starring in the first run picture now showing at the Eugene Drive In Theatre.

In 1942, his first year on the Wisconsin varsity, Hirsch was named All American halfback, and won the lasting nickname, "Crazylegs."

Enlisting in the Marines, Hirsch transferred to the University of Michigan, site of the V-12 training program, and again made All-American, in 1943. He also became starting center on the basketball team, star pitcher for the baseball nine, and leading broadjumper on the track squad. Just before reporting for active Marine service, he was honored as first man ever to win letters in four major sports in one year at Michigan.

Featured in "Crazylegs" are 18 of Hirsch's teammates with the Los Angeles Rams, among them Bob Waterfield, Tom Fears, Norman Van Brocklin, Tank Younger, Night Train Lane and Larry Brink. One of the highlights of the picture, particularly for football fans, are the game scenes. These are all from original film coverage of Hirsch making spectacular plays in games while with Wisconsin, Michigan, the Chicago All-Star Game of 1946 and Los Angeles Rams professional contests.
