Free throws by Barney Holland, Wegner, Anderson, a tip in by Ross and a two-hand set by Howard Page finally tied the score at 55 all with a 1:00 left in the third quarter.

Bob Stout layed in another basket for Oregon, but the Cougars led at the quarter's end on a doubleton by Rehder and singleton by Captain Bob Swanson.

Page hit on another set to begin the fourth quarter and Halberg added a free throw to give Oregon its first lead since the opening minutes. Bennink and Perry put in gifters for a 60-all tie, but Bob Hawes, who went into the game very late in the third period, found the range on a 35foot one-hander to give Oregon a lead it never relinquished.

Wegner added two on a jump, Hawes scored two more fielders and a free throw, and Anderson contributed a charity toss for a 70-65 Duck lead.
