Constitution for the WOMEN'S RECREATION ASSOCIATION

of the UNIVERSITY OF OREGON

(Affiliated with the UO Women's Physical Education Department)

Organized October 9, 1913 Revised January, 1954 proposed for adoption by the mem-

bership in the winter term elections of 1954, to replace the present inadequate constitution.

ARTICLE I

Name and Purpose Secion 1. The name of this organization shall be the Women's Recreation Association of

the University of Oregon. Section 2. The purpose of the Women's Rec-reation Association shall be to stimulate interest in physical activities of a social and recreational nature for all women stu-dents of the University of Oregon, and to rovide opportunities for participation and leadership in such activiti

ARTICLE II Membership

Section 1. All women enrolled in the Uni-

Women's Recreation Association. Section 2. Active member, as defined by Arti-cle 1, Section 1 of the By-Laws, shall

have voting privileges.

ARTICLE III

Officers and Government Section 1. Elected officers of this organization shall be: trealdent, vicepresident, secretary, treasurer, custodian, and ser-geant-at-arms.

section 2. Appointed officers of this organization shall be: Head of sports, publicity chairman, club representatives, intramural

managers, and historian. Section 3. The WRA Council shall consist of all elective and appointive officers. The functions of this body shall be to act in an administrative capacity for the Association and to carry out all business which concerns the Association. Section 4. The WRA Executive Committee

shall consist of the president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, head of sports and adviser. The duties of this Commit-tee shall be to make preliminary plans for the organization as defined in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE IV Amendments

Section 1. The Constitution of the Women's Recreation Association may be amended by a two-thirds yote of the active members present at any regular meeting, provided notice of such amendments shall have been publicized for at least one week preceding


