Credits Offered

Each credit hour taken at the University costs \$8, and each is worth one and a half hours at Oregon. The session there lasts from June 23 to Aug. 3.

According to the Eugene Travel Service booklet on the tour, cottons and sport clothes should be stressed in planning a wardrobe for the trip. Two swim suits should be included, it added, as well as formals and beach equipment for hours of tanning.

A fee deposit of \$50 is collected when a student joins the tour. which is refundable up to April 15.
