

George Shaw's .419 Mark Paces Webfoot Bat Parade

Center - fielder George Shaw continues to lead the Oregon Ducks in batting through 10 games with a batting average of .419. Shaw has hit safely on 18 of his 43 times at bat. Second place among the regulars is held by catcher Neal Marlett

with 13 safeties in 36 tries or an average of .361. Dick Schlosstein is in third place with a mark of .348.

Shaw has included amongst his blows four home runs, a triple and two doubles. His homer total is a best for the Ducks.

Schlosstein with three doubles to his credit holds the top spot in this department, followed by Shaw and Bob Wagner with two each. Schlosstein is also second in home runs with two four-ply swats.

Four Ducks have connected for three base hits and are currently tied for the top mark in this stage of the game. Shaw, John Keller, Jerry Ross and Jim Johnson are the men who have connected for triples.

Shaw is tops in both runs scored and total hits with 14 and 18 respectively. Marlett is the second best run producer with nine and Schlosstein is second in hits with 16.

As a team Don Kirsch's crew has pounded out 113 blows in 394 times at bat for a team batting average of .287. The team has 11 doubles, four triples and nine homers to its credit.

Seattle Next

The Ducks, who have now won four of six Northern Division games, will take a rest from ND action this weekend when they play two non-conference tussles. On Friday afternoon the Ducks host the strong Seattle university Chieftains and on Saturday the Webfoots play a game with the Oregon Alumni team which will be made up of several old Duck grads who were players during their stay at the University.
