

# George Shaw Leads Oregon Bat Parade with .400 Mark

Although he failed to hit safely in the Seattle university game, center-fielder George Shaw continued to dominate University of Oregon baseball statistics through the first eleven games of the season.

Shaw, with marks attained in the alumni game last Saturday not counted, has the best batting mark among the regulars with an even .409 percentage. Shaw has compiled his average on the wings of 18 safe hits in 45 trips to the dish. First baseman Dick Schlosstein is second in the batting department with 16 hits in 49 official tries for a batting average of .326. Neal Marlett is a close third with 13 for 40 and a mark of .325. All three of these top batters lost percentage points from their batting marks in the Seattle game as they all went hitless. Marlett lost the most, falling from .361 to .325.

### Wagner Advances

Out-fielder Bob Wagner was the only player to make any appreciable gain against the Chieftans. Wagner walloped a home run and a single in four times up to advance his mark from .250 to .281.

to gain, with a four point jump from .292 to .296.

Shaw also leads the team in total runs scored and total hits. Slugging George has crossed the plate 15 times in his eleven games and has hit safely 18 times in the same number of tussles.

Shortstop John Keller is second in runs with 10 and Marlett is third with nine. In the total hits department Dick Schlosstein is second to Shaw with 16 and Keller is third with 15.

### Shaw Tops in Homers

Shaw is the top home run hitter with four and Marlett and Schlosstein are the only other players to hit more than one. Each has two round-trippers to his credit.

No player has hit more than one triple and at present time five men are tied for the lead with one apiece. Shaw, Marlett, Keller, Ross and Jim Johnson all have one and three-baser.

Schlosstein leads in doubles with three to his credit. Shaw, Ross and Wagner all have two to closely follow him.

As a team the Ducks are hitting at a .250 clip, a seven point drop from last week. They have pounded out 118 base-knocks in 422 tries. They have scored 76 runs.

Among the Webfoot hits have been 12 doubles, five triples and 10 homers.

# Webfoots Smack Idaho Nine, 8-4

The combined four-hit pitching of Trent Huls and Bill Blodgett and a spectacular catch by center-fielder George Shaw kept the Vandals under control. Huls was credited with the pitching win.

Shaw made a leaping one-handed catch of a hard hit ball to retire the Vandals in the fourth with the bases loaded.

Neal Marlett was Oregon's leading batter of the day with two hits in four times up.
