

# Webfoots Practice Minus Three Players

The Oregon football team ran through a long scrimmage session Tuesday afternoon minus three of its top players, but Oregon coaches termed their replacements adequate.

**George Shaw, who re-injured a pulled leg muscle in the Stanford game, was out of practice for the second straight day, and spent the afternoon under a heat lamp.**

**Dick Mobley, who started at end against Stanford, spent Monday in the infirmary after sustaining a bruised muscle over his kidney and did not work out Tuesday.**

### McGee Still Out

Jasper McGee, who came up with a rib cartilage separation in the Idaho game two weeks ago, still was not back. McGee was also sporting a puffed eye from a punch thrown in the brawl after the Stanford game.

Johnny Keller took over the quarterback job in place of Shaw during the scrimmage. In the backfield with him were Dick James and Walt Gaffney at half-

backs and Dean Van Leuven at fullback. Van Leuven, who turned in a fine job against Stanford, was filling in for McGee.

### Line Changes Made

Phil McHugh, a sophomore who grabbed the only intercepted pass in the Stanford game, was running at end in place of Mobley. Coach Len Casanova made one other change in the Oregon line, moving Sophomore Reanous Cochrane up to the "green" team at left guard. Cochrane, from Coos Bay, stands only 5'9" but weighs 189 pounds.

The remainder of the "green" team was made up of the same men who started the last game. Hal Reeve was at the other end, Keith Tucker and Lon Stiner were at the tackles, Jack Patara at right guard, and Ron Pheister at center.

Prior to the scrimmage, the Oregon coaches had the linemen working on blocking and tackling drills and practicing charging. The backs and ends spent most of their time running through plays and working on defense.

It is doubtful how much any of the three injured players will play against the Utah Redskins Saturday. Shaw will probably not see any action, the Oregon coach-

ing staff being unwilling to take a chance on further injury in a game which will not count in Coast conference standings.

Bob Officer, the Oregon trainer, said Monday that Mobley might see action in the Utah game but couldn't say definitely. McGee worked out in sweat clothes Monday, but missed Tuesday's drill completely.

Positions open to freshman men include chairmanships for the service, promotion and conferences and social activities chairmen. An assistant to the social chairman is also needed, according to Roberts.

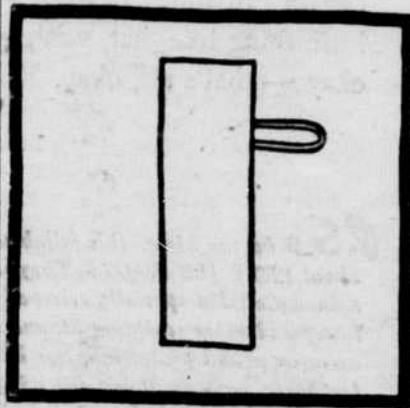
The petitions are due by Monday, Oct. 11, in the YM offices in the Student Union.



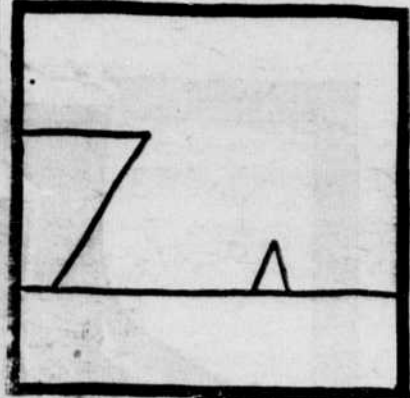
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
