An automatic sprinkler system, operated by electric clocks, has replaced the old manually placed sprinklers in some spots around the campus.

The new system with its underground piping network has been installed in the area west of Villard hall, along the highway, next to the millrace, around portions of Commonwealth hall, and in the area east of the architecture annex and near the science building.
