AROUND THE GLOBE French Officials Admit Espionage

PARIS (AP)—Police said two high ranking officials of the French defense ministry confessed Friday to leaking secrets from the national defense council. There was no immediate indication who got the leaked information.

Previous announcements during the investigation indicated the top secret information had been transmitted to the French Communist Party's high command.

The two men—Rene Turpin, chief of the personal staff of the permanent secretary general in the defense department, and Roger Labrusse, chief administrator in the same department—were ordered before the military magistrate investigating the leaks.

Both held top civil service positions and, as a result, might normally be entitled to be present at meetings of the defense council.

Floods Hit India

BOMBAY, India (AP)—Floods caused by a freak monsoon storm that pelted the Tapti River valley with 14 inches of rain in 40 hours have brought death and destruction to a 3,000 square mile area 150 miles north of Bombay.

Rain Hampers Relief

BALBOA, C. Z. (AP)—Heavy rain still pelted the flooded areas of northwest Honduras Thursday night, hampering relief and rescue operations by U. S. military planes and landing craft.

Police Seek Asylum

BERLIN (AP)—West Berlin police announced Friday that 270 members of the East German Communist police force requested political asylum here in September.

Change Ordered

SAIGON, Indochina (AP)—Chief of State Bao Dai Friday ordered Premier Ngo Dinh Diem to end the South Viet Nam political crisis by taking army chief of staff Nguyen Van Vinh into his cabinet.

Foreign Study Awards Open

Thirty foreign countries are represented by approximately 110 students on the University campus this year, according to K. S. Ghent, foreign student adviser. The group comprises about two percent of the student body.

Most of them come from Canada, China, India and the Philippines. The largest percentage of foreign students are Chinese. Two trackmen from Australia who participated in the British Empire games are enrolled.

The majority of students are financing their own education. The others have room and board scholarships given by the dormitories, sororities and fraternities. A few foreign students have graduate assistantships. These include four from India, and one from Sweden. Two men, from Germany and Italy, and a woman from Peru are graduate assistants in the school of architecture and allied arts.

Hawaiian and Alaskan students are not considered as foreign students, Ghent reports, because they are U.S. citizens.

Tope Participates In Book Meeting
