

# Rush Display Explodes Injuring Girl at Linfield

McMINNVILLE-(AP)—A homemade flare at a Linfield college fraternity house exploded Friday night, putting a girl in a hospital with serious injuries and hurting three other persons including the head of the chemistry department.

Delores Reeder, 21, freshman from Springfield, was taken to a Portland hospital which reported that full extent of her injuries had not been determined at noon Saturday. Pieces of a shattered pipe pierced her back.

The flare, in the rear lawn of the Delta Psi Delta house, was made of a weed killing chemical and sugar, in an iron pipe. Students reported testing it twice earlier in the day for safety.

Lighted as part of a pre-rushing party display, it began to burn, then suddenly exploded, hurling pieces of the pipe through the group watching nearby.

Hurt, but not enough to be hospitalized, were Luther Taylor, college chemistry department head who is adviser to the fraternity; Lorraine Anderson, freshman from West Seattle; and

Robert Morton, sophomore from Coos Bay.

The hospital at Portland reported that until it was determined just what internal damage had been caused by the pipe fragments, extent of Miss Reeder's injuries would be uncertain. In general her condition was said to be fair.
